Introduction

P. L. PARMEGGIANI

This symposium is dedicated to sleep onset, that, as any process of change, is hard to be defined in dynamical terms. Moreover, many questions are still unsettled concerning the mechanisms underlying its evolution. A few preliminary words are, therefore, justified to encompass the research fields related to this topic and to indicate the reasonably limited aims of this symposium.

The classical reviews of Kleitman (1963), Moruzzi (1972) and Jouvet (1972) contain background information concerning, respectively, the phenomenal, neurophysiological and neurochemical aspects of the mechanisms underlying sleep onset. Ethological studies pointing to the instinctive nature of the behaviour of sleep onset are thoroughly reviewed in an assay by Moruzzi (1969) and the problem of the central representation of this behaviour is approached in several investigations (Hess 1944; Akimoto et al. 1956; Sterman and Clemente 1962; Roelofs et al. 1963; Parmeggiani 1964). There is no doubt, however, that the process of sleep onset is far from being understood. More work has to be done in order to further identify its mechanisms and to analyze their function also with respect to exogenous and endogenous inputs relevant to its development.

On this basis, it may be appreciated that the contributions to this symposium deal with both factors influencing the onset of sleep and aspects of its phenomenology. In particular, Dr Puizillout examines the influence on sleep onset of vegetative inputs of brain stem mechanisms and Dr Borbély of exogenous and endogenous factors acting at higher levels of integration. Dr Webb presents metrological considerations on significant temporal variables of sleep onset, while Dr Lugaresi comments on specific changes in motor, respiratory and circulatory functions and Dr Oswald on objective and subjective psychic phenomena of sleep onset. Finally, sleep onset is analyzed by Dr Salzarulo and Dr Billiard from the ontogenetic and pathologic points of view, respectively.
