内 容 提 要

本书前半部分提供了八套最新高校英语专业四级考试预测试卷,无论题型还是具体内容都与真题十分贴近;后半部分为2003—2006年全国高校英语专业四级统考真题。不论预测试卷还是真题,本书除了给出答案外,还给出了详尽、到位的解释,听力部分给出了听力原文,使学生知其然,还知其所以然,掌握应试技巧,提高解题能力。

本书既可用作高校英语专业四级考试的准备用书,亦可作为非英语专业的六级考试以及其他方面中、高级水平的英语自学者的学习参考资料。本书另附送听力部分录音 MP3 光盘一张,如需音带,请与复旦大学出版社联系。

前 言

全国英语专业四级考试已经走过了十多个春秋,在此期间市面上见到的专业四级考试辅导用书不计其数,质量良莠不齐,品种名目繁多。我也主编出版了几本相关书籍,像《高校英语专业四级考试技巧与训练》(复旦大学出版社,1999),《高校英语专业四级大纲词汇精讲与模拟测试》(复旦大学出版社,2001),《高校英语专业四级大纲词汇一点通》(复旦大学出版社,2002)和《高校英语专业四级考试技巧与训练》(全新版)(复旦大学出版社,2003)均受到了读者的欢迎。市场销量是最好的证明,1999年由复旦大学出版社出版的《高校英语专业四级考试技巧训练》,三年内销售了八万多册。该书的成功与编者对考纲的把握、题型的研究和学生需求的了解密切相关。近年来,全国英语专业四级考试的考纲做了修改,考试题型有了新的变化,同时学生对辅导书的要求也发生了改变。但是,在历年的复习备考过程中无论是老师还是学生都会把握两点:一是对往年真题的研究,另一就是系统地做一些练习。针对此,我们结合多年来的教学经验,推出了这本独特、新颖、实用的辅导书,它具有以下特点:

- 1. 真题、预测题二合一。本书一改普通辅导书单一练习的做法,将近四年的全国高校英语专业考试真题、答案和详细解释与系统的预测题编在一起,这样省去了师生既要买真题,又要买辅导书的烦恼。一书在手,全盘把握。
- 2. 注解详细、到位。本书真题和预测题除了给出答案外,还给出了详尽的解释。8 套 预测题和4 套真题的完形填空、语法词汇和阅读理解,不但给出选择正确答案的理由,还尽可能地给出相关的知识点,如相关的语法知识和词与词的区别等,与其他辅导书相比,能更有效地帮助学生复习和培养解题能力。
- 3. 预测题更贴近真题。本书的 8 套预测练习题无论题型还是具体内容都尽量与真题靠近。听力、语法词汇、阅读、写作每个单项在难度、信度和材料的新鲜度方面都进行反复筛选,其中有相当一部分是编者多年教学经验的积累和总结。

本书与我主编的 1999 年初版、2003 再版的《高校英语专业四级考试技巧与训练》不同的是,去掉了解题技巧部分,而将精力更加集中于解题能力的培养上,相信广大考生通过这本书提供的系统练习和对近年来统考真题的分析能够顺利地通过全国英语专业四级考试,并取得优异的成绩。

本书的编写再次得到了复旦大学出版社外语分社的大力支持,编者在此表示衷心的 感谢!

Whether or not animals feel is not altogether an easy question to answer. A human being has direct awareness only of the pains which he himself suffers. Our knowledge of the pains even of other human beings is only an inference from their words, and to a lesser extent their . 10.
