前 言

《新編大学英语四级考试过关丛书》是参照国家教育部 1999年 5月 25日新颁布的《大学英语教学大纲(修订本)》的基本要求以及相关的词汇表编写的。由长期从事英语教学、经验丰富的英语教师集体完成。本丛书主要面向即将参加大学英语四级考试的在读大学本、专科学生及具有同等水平的读者。目的是帮助读者尽早了解《大学英语教学大纲(修订本)》在语言基础和应用能力上的新要求,尽快熟悉四级考试中的各种题型,提高考前学习效率,顺利通过四级考试。

丛书之一的《模拟试题》体现了《大学英语教学大纲(修订本)》 "着重考核语言基础和语言能力"的精神,对该大纲的语法结构表、语言技能表和词汇表实行全面覆盖。全书共分三部分:第一部分为 10 套全真模拟试题,其中编写了新题型简答题四篇(编入模拟试题 1、2、7、8);复合式听写和完形填空四篇(编入模拟试题 3、4、5、6);汉译英两篇(编入模拟试题 9 和 10)。第二部分是 10 套模拟试题的答案、注释和范文。第三部分为听力部分的录音文字材料。
