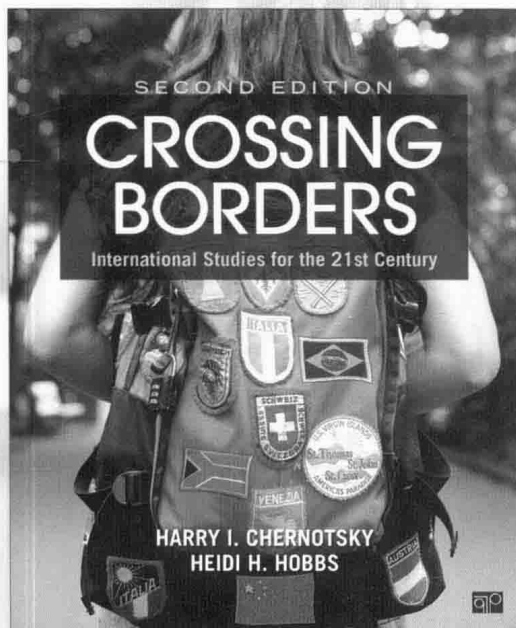

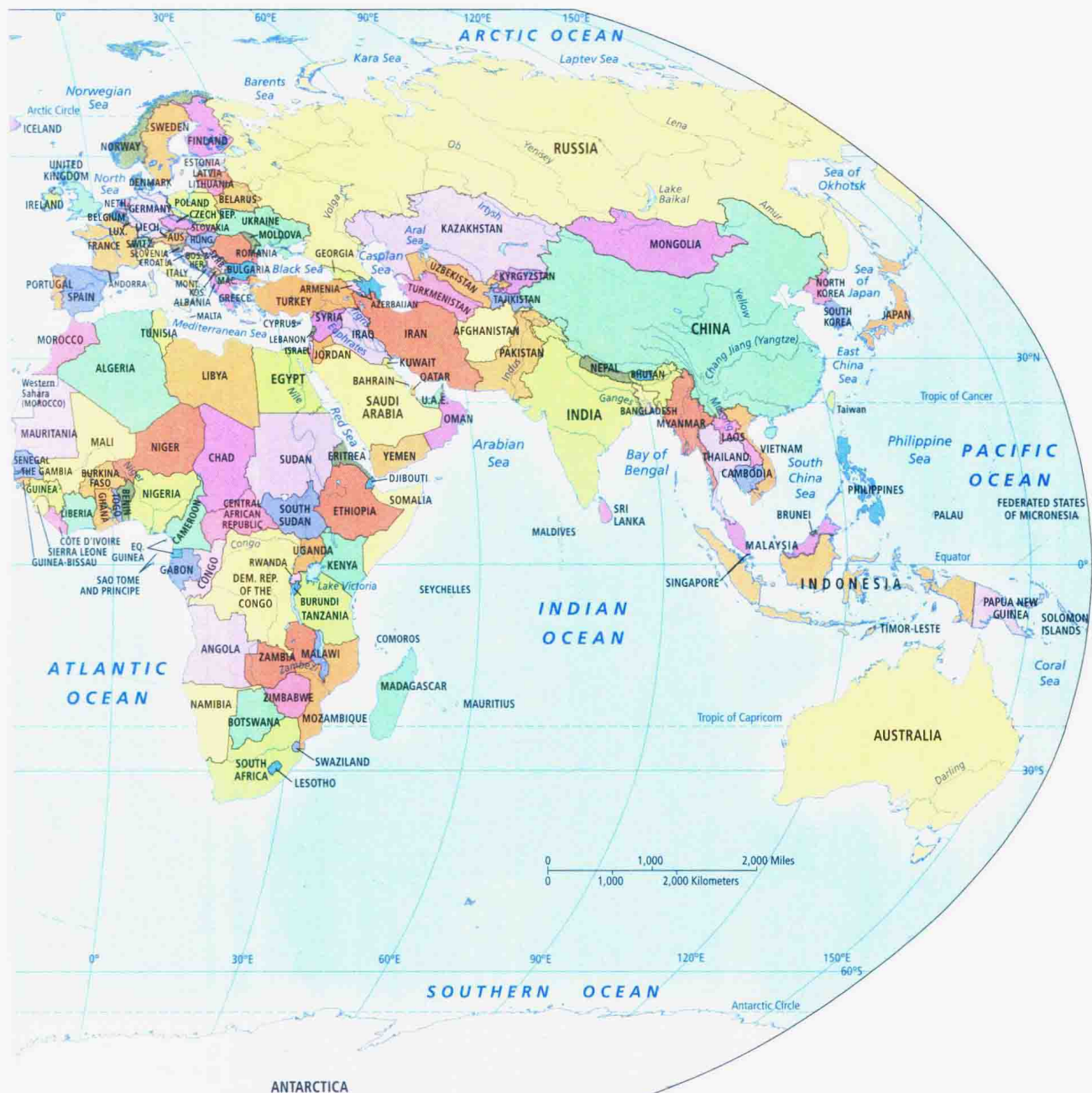
THE WORLD'S GEOGRAPHICAL BORDERS



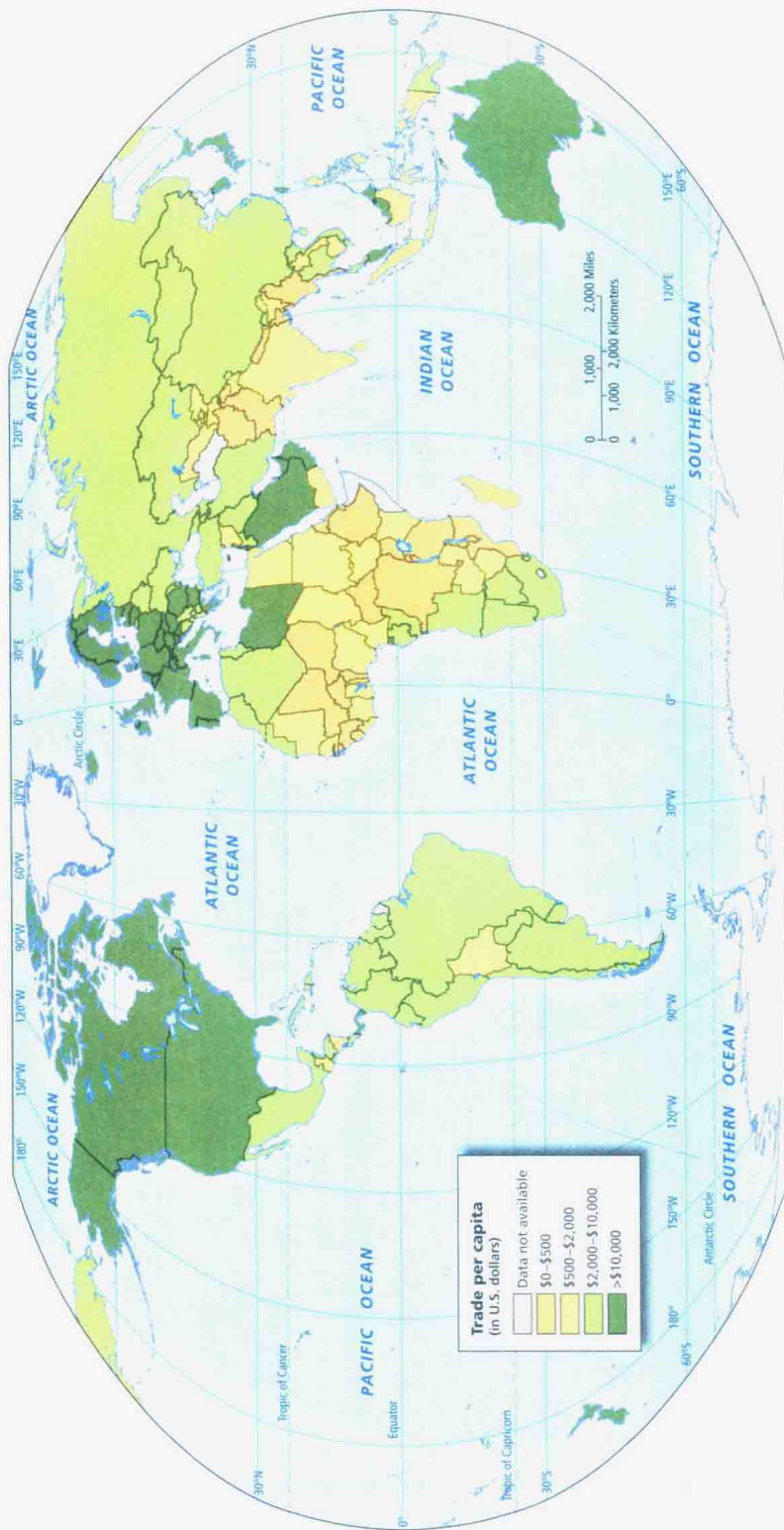


THE WORLD'S POLITICAL BORDERS



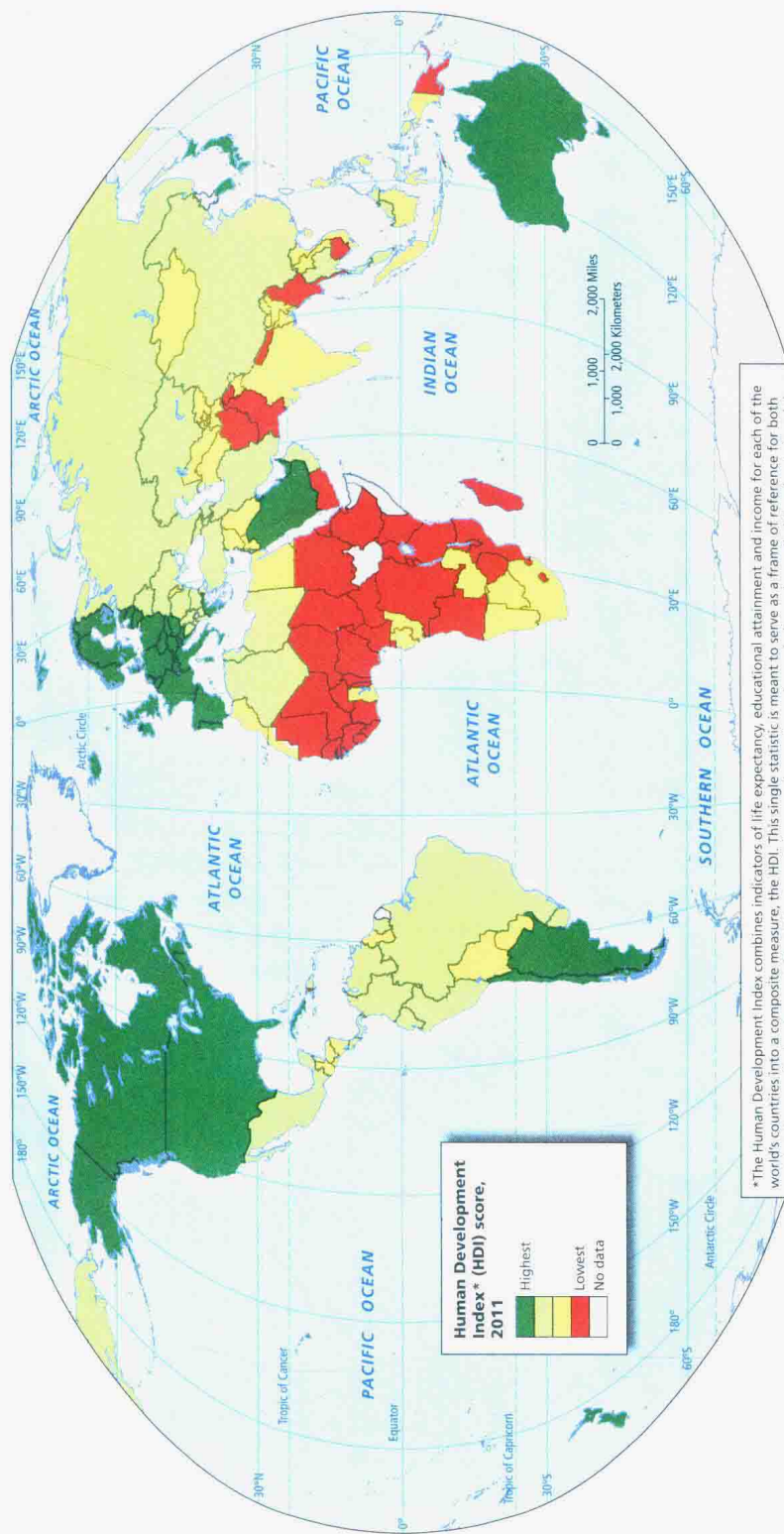


THE WORLD'S ECONOMIC AND TRADE BORDERS

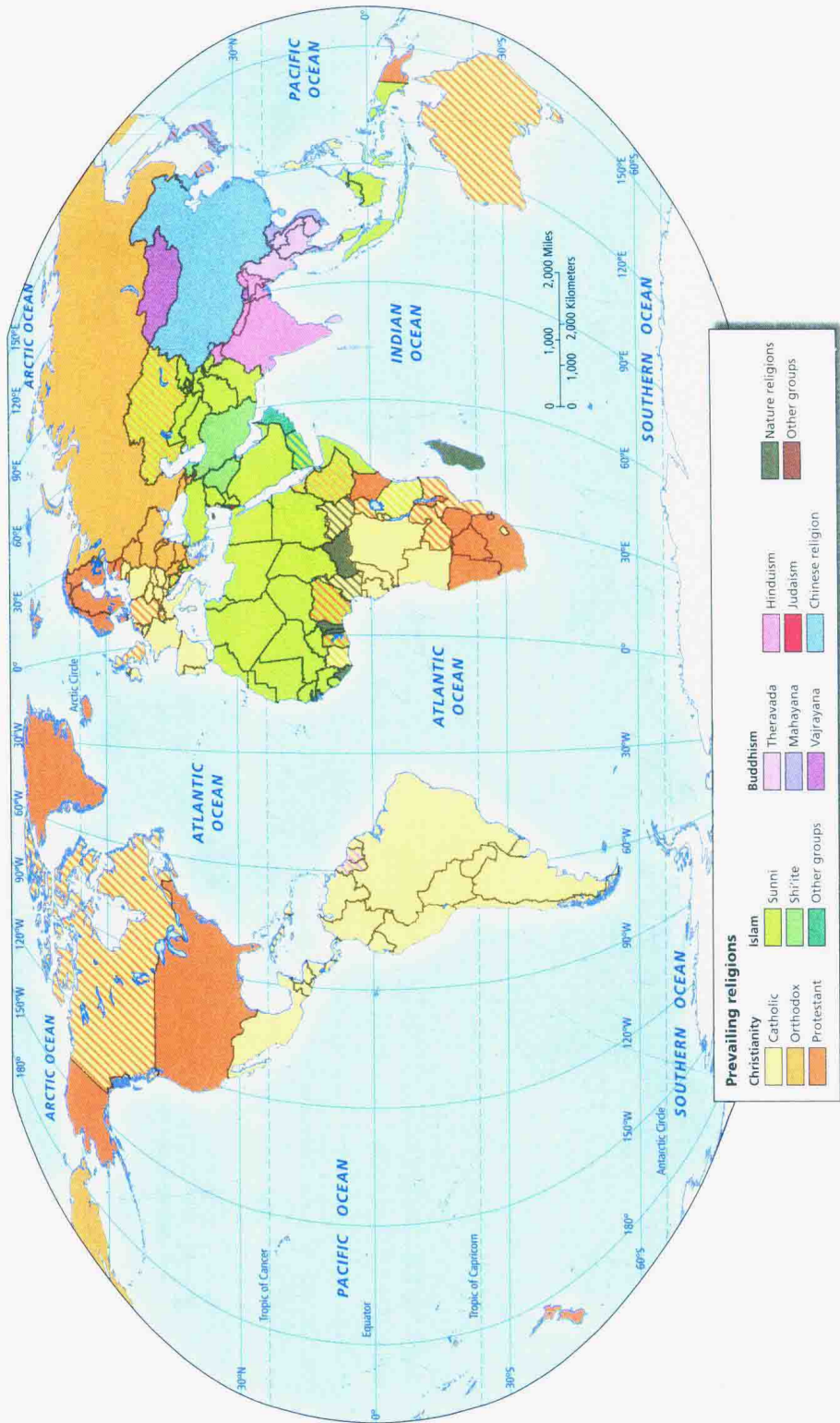
THE WORLD'S SOCIAL BORDERS



*The Human Development Index combines indicators of life expectancy, educational attainment and income for each of the world's countries into a composite measure, the HDI. This single statistic is meant to serve as a frame of reference for both social and economic development. The HDI sets a minimum and a maximum for each dimension, called "goalposts," and then shows where each country stands in relation to these goalposts, expressed as a value between 0 (lowest human development) and 1 (highest human development).

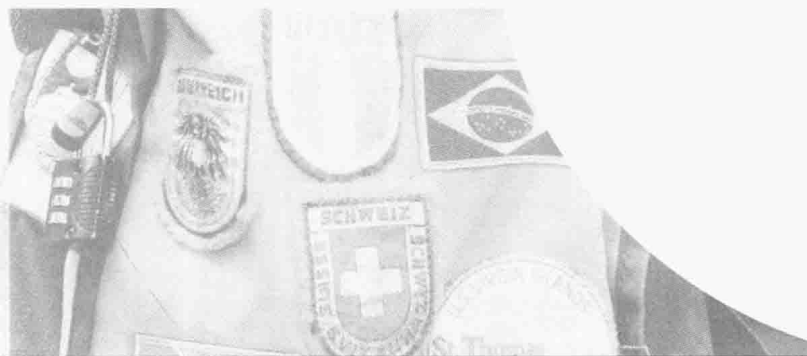
