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P前言reface

词类变化能力是中国的英语学习者在学习英语时必须克服的一大难点,培养和测试英语学习者的词类变化能力始终是英语教学和各类英语考试的重点。以前,教师采用介绍构词法知识或采用语法分析法来处理此问题,效果并不理想。本书向英语学习者和英语教师介绍了一种全新的学习法——语境学习法。本书为每一组同根词创设语境,学习者可以在语境中体验到每个词的含义、词性、用法,并洞察词类是如何在变化的。编者所做的试验表明,语境教学法是解决中国的英语学习者词类变化能力的有效方法;试验还表明,此方法是深受学生欢迎的好方法。根据试验结果,编者将训练材料编辑成书,希望与更多英语学习者和英语教师分享这一好方法。本书具有以下特色:

- ① 符合英语教学的新理念。建构主义认为,人脑是通过自下而上的过程建构知识的,学生需要通过自身体验构建知识。本书为每一组同根词创设语境,让学生在语境中体验每组词的含义和用法,使学生亲自积累有关英语词性变化的心得体会,自我构建知识。
- ② 为学生提供必要的支持手段。本书穿插介绍了相关的构词法知识,这是学习英语词性变化的必备知识。
- ③ 配备有巩固和发展学生能力的练习。认定词类练习和填空练习可以丰富和巩固学生在先前语境阅读中所获得的知识。
- ④ 节省查字典的时间。书后配备的词汇索引,配有每个词的汉语注释,学生遇到难词时不必查字典,看索引即可。
- ⑤ 本书还可充当词汇学习手册。本书包含 191 组词,词汇总量超过 900,当作一本词汇学习书,也不失为一种很好的选择。
- ⑥ 本书所提供的词汇学习模式既新颖又独特。运用语境法培养学生的词类变化能力,这在目前市面上所能看到的同类书籍中独树一帜。
- ⑦ 本书既可以作为教材又可以作为自学读本。高中和高职高专学校的学生,需要教师的辅导。教师可利用每次上课开始的5-10分钟,以本书为教材,向学生讲解一课内容。如果是本科生,自学本教材即可。

由于时间仓促,错误在所难免,望读者多批评指正。
