Preface

The book originates from the cycle of conferences on the topic "Towards Rio+20: the challenges of international environmental law and sustainable development" – organised at the University of Salerno in May–June 2012 by the *Observatory on Human Rights: Bioethics, Health, Environment* – and it gathers the updated and enlarged version of the papers presented during those seminars as well as other contributions covering most of the topics addressed in "The Future We Want."

This is an innovative and original book which addresses in an analytical and critical way the issues raised by Rio+20. Its content offers a wealth of information from world leading experts in the fields of international law, international health law and international environmental law. The book offers a unique insight in issues which are at the core of the contemporary management of social, environmental and economic questions.
