# Preface

Every year defective products cause millions of accidents resulting in personal injury and property damage in Europe. The liabilities arising from such accidents are a key concern to those involved in the manufacture and sale of products in Europe. The rights granted to consumers to enforce such liabilities reflect a trend of increased consumer protection in Europe which is to be welcomed. Indeed the consumer protection laws of EU countries have developed significantly over the last decade. Since the first edition, two important Directives have been issued, namely, the Product Safety Directive and the Unfair Contract Terms Directive. There have also been important developments in European case law which add further rights to consumers.

The need to know and understand the rights and liabilities established by these laws is a pre-requisite to the ability to export, manufacture and distribute consumer goods successfully. This book offers a practical guide to those laws, and the steps to be taken as a result of them.
