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前 言

英语听力技能是多种语言能力的综合产物,它涉及到语音、语调、语法、句型,乃至文化与社会背景等各方面的知识。所以接受者即听者除了需要熟悉常用单词或词组的发音,特别是其在连贯说话或快速口语中的发音外,还必须掌握大量的口语句型及其功能,具备扎实的语法基础,了解语言的文化背景、谈话时的具体情景和谈话者的语气等等。提高英语听说水平,学员应该学会用英语"思考"问题、组织"思路"和表达"思想",不断努力,持之以恒,力争"打开"头脑中的"英语频道"。

我国由于特定的语言环境,学生学习外语往往从书面形式的单词、句子和语法规则开始,并且通过检查学生的词汇量、语法概念、阅读和笔译能力来衡量其外语水平。结果,我国英语学员的听说技能明显"滞后",在英语听力方面,学生要么是"只能识其形,不能辨其音",要么是虽然能通过听力理解个别单词的语意,但一旦该词出现在正常语速的句子中或真实的语言环境下,就无法听懂意思或作出正确的理解。

在人类新世纪到来之际,社会和经济的发展需要世界各国人民进一步加强交流,增进合作,早日实现世界的普遍繁荣。外语的听说能力是语言交际的关键,也是语言学习和进一步提高的重要途径。当前,政府与社会各阶层越来越重视对外语的学习,特别是对外语听说技能的培养,本教程根据我国学员对英语听力技能的需要和实际而编写,教学对象是已经具备中等层次英语听说水平的学员,如大学高年级学生或自学考试本科段学员。本教程总计有 16 个教学单元,每单元分两大部分:预备听力练习(WARM-UP EXERCISES)和综合听力训练(COMPREHENSIVE LISTENING PRACTICE)。其中综合听力训练的编写力求选材多样,词汇丰富,有一定的趣味性和知识性;并且尽力在各方面接近有关考试的全真试题,如:英语专业本科段的〈口译与听力〉考试;〈英语高级口译资格证书〉考试等,以检验学员在实际考试中的发挥水准。每单元在预备听力练习和综合听力训练前还列举出相应的词汇,供教学或自学参考。本教程配有录音带,并附有录音文字和练习题的参考答案。培训时可根据教学需要或学员的水平进行反复练习,不断扩大听力词汇,巩固提高听力理解能力。本书配套录音磁带由上海外语音像出版社出版。

本教程既可作为我国大学生的英语听力强化教材,亦可供英语学员自学以进一步提高英语听力技能。教学进度如按每单元授课时间为三至六课时计算,每周三至六课时,学完全书需要三个月到一学期的时间。听力强化班和自学者可酌情缩短或延长学习时间。

本教程编写时间紧迫,疏漏之处在所难免,欢迎专家、读者提出宝贵的意见。

使用说明

本教程配有预备听力练习(WARM-UP EXERCISES)和综合听力训练(COMPREHENSIVE LISTENING PRACTICE)的录音磁带,为方便学员使用,现将各部分的参考答题时间列举如下:

- (1) 预备听力练习(WARM-UP EXERCISES)的答题时间为每题 12 秒。
- (2) 综合听力训练(COMPREHENSIVE LISTENING PRACTICE)中第一部分听写 (Part A: Spot Dictation)的答题时间为每篇 180 秒左右;第一部分听力理解(Part B: Listening Comprehension)中选择题的答题时间为每题 12 秒—15 秒,是非题的答题时间为每篇(即每 5 题)90 秒;第三部分听译(Part C: Listening and Translation)单句翻译的答题时间为每题 55 秒左右,篇章翻译的答题时间为每篇 180 秒左右。第四部分(Part D: Note-taking and Gap-filling)开始前应先听录音,并在记录纸上努力记笔记。听完录音后才能打开试题进行操练。答题时间为 480 秒左右。
- (3) 为了节省磁带,减轻读者负担,本教程综合测试题的听力部分除第一单元作为样题留出答题时间外,其余单元的练习在录音带上不再留答题时间,学员可根据每项练习后注明的答题时间自行停机并进行练习。
