前 言

《主题听力》(Themes for Listening) 共分五册,每册包含20个单元,是为初、中级英语水平的英语学习者设计的综合性听力教材。

《主题听力》由上海师范大学外国语学院听力教研室主任李永宁副教授主编,上海交通大学外国语学院俞理明教授,上海师范大学外国语学院讲师吕晓红,上海市三女中英语教研室主任吴喆以及李永宁编写;全书文稿经新西兰 Barry Natusch 教授审阅;上海徐汇区教育局副局长杜俭副教授与上海奉贤中学的(上海市)英语特级教师张育青对本套书的编著工作提出宝贵意见;华东师范大学外国语学院的资深语音教师张晴,以及外籍教师参加了本套教材的录音工作,在此一并致谢。

《主题听力》汲取了当今二语习得理论的成果,并结合我们中国人学习英语的特点,围绕我们日常生活、学习、工作等话题(topics),对听力语料进行从易到难、循序渐进地编排。部分话题在这五册书中重复出现,但这绝非简单的重复,而是话题的深度和语言的难度比前一册更进一层次。我们把学习语言以交际为目的作为编写的原则,力求听力语料的时代感、多样化与实用性,并具有实际听力语料的一些特点,如信息的重复,语气词等等口头语言特征。本教材着重听力基础技能训练,每单元分三个部分: Part II 为听写,旨在训练学员辨音和拼写能力,以及理解单词、句子层面意义的能力。Part II 和Part III 为语篇理解,其中至少一篇是对话理解,旨在训练学员听懂会话及讲话主题,说话人的意图和大意,理解具体信息,以及推断未直言信息的能力。我们力求听力练习无法分形式多样化,并力求每单元至少设计一个 Task—based 听力练习。Task—based 听力,为活动形式多样化,并力求每单元至少设计一个 Task—based 听力练习。Task—based 听力结别,还是电话留言,填表,写备忘录、便条、通知、告示等等。我们在强调听力基础技能训练的同时,还注重英语语言知识的学习,尤其是对英语词汇的积累,因此我们在每个单元里附上词汇注释,便于学员学习。同时每册书至少配备两套试题以便让学员了解自己学习的进展,提高学习动机。

《主题听力》不是为应试而设计的听力试题练习,然而《主题听力》却是一套为通过各类听力测试打下扎实语言基础、训练听力基础技能、熟悉各类题型的教材。

本教材的编者均为在职教师,我们在繁重的教学工作之余将其编就而成。因我们能力有限,会有疏忽不当之处,望读者和专家学者指正,以便日后修订。
