《博士英语教程》已经在教学的基础上进行了多次改进。现在正式出版,加上了 将近十年来所积累的关于听说的训练材料,所以,此次修订有了重大的变化,即:将 这一教材的目的定义为"在听、说、读、写四方面全面提高使用英语的能力"。

国家教委 1992 年下达的《学位研究生英语教学大纲》中对博士生英语水平的要求 凝缩为三条: (一) 熟练的阅读能力; (二) 较好的写作能力; (三) 一定的听说能力。

本教材按其要求而编,目的在于: (一) 对阅读技巧做出全面总结,并在大学以及硕士研究生英语水平的基础上提高阅读速度、理解能力、分析能力以及准确性,为日后的大量文献阅读做出方法性的指导; (二) 重点介绍阐述性文章的写作方法,包括句法、段落及总体文章的结构,以便使同学能用英语正确明了地阐述自己的观点,写出观点明确、逻辑紧密、详略得当、结构合理的学术论文(其方法也可以移植在中文的写作中)。

本教材同时是一次将阅读与写作这两门基本技能合二项为一教的尝试。所选文章既是扩大词汇与句型以及培养语感的好文章,同时也是以不同方法来阐述观点的写作典范。尤其是"科学研究方法"(The Method of Scientific Investigation)一文,不仅能对阅读技巧做出全面的总结及检阅,更是英语世界中几乎人所共知的科技写作高峰,是模仿的对象。所选文章的文字深奥、结构复杂时,所训练的是阅读技巧以及语言感觉;文章的文字浅显、结构简单时,训练的侧重点则在于写作技巧及其运用。无论具体课文是否深浅,教材的整体性在于对阅读与写作进行全面的、总结性的同步训练。

国家教委现在更名为教育部,十多年过去了,但针对博士生的要求却并没有新的教学大纲。但是,现在国家改革开放的形势比十年前更好,对我们所培养的人才提出了更高的要求,在英语能力方面的要求更加突出,首先就要求过听说关。因此,我们现在的教学大纲首先尊重以前的第一条和第二条,在第三条上修改两个字,即: 过硬的听说能力。

所谓"过硬的听说能力",主要表现在: (一) 在听的方面,要克服在听英语的过程中必须通过汉语来理解的毛病,要能直接对所听到的内容用英语反应,因此而能够对所听到的内容有足够的时间和空间来思索其意义的合理性,达到真正意义上的理解,或者说,达到理解的高级阶段; (二) 在说的方面,要求达到能在国际讲坛上宣读自己的英语文章,或者经过一定的准备能用英语作报告,具体要求为语音、语调基本正确,节奏上轻重缓急得当,逻辑分明,言语规范,意义准确无误。

在整个课程的学习期间,每一天都有新的内容,每一周都有新的要求,每一个学生都要求上讲台。听说方面,教师除了对整个班级每周提出新要求外,还必须根据每个学生的不同的实际情况提出不同的要求和训练的重点。

每个学生的起点可能都会不一样,但最终的要求是一致的。多年的教学实践证明: 只要能够确实去完成好自己每天必须完成的任务,就一定能在最后达到我们定义的 "过硬的听说能力",而不管他的起点是什么。

条条道路通罗马。望同学们尽快地找准自己的位置,找准自己前进的道路。

《博士英语教程》尽管已经试用了多年,此次正式出版又承蒙了出版社诸位同志的精心校阅,但一定还有不少的不当之处,敬请指正。

最后,向出版社为出版此教材所付出的辛勤劳动表示衷心的感谢。
