写在前面

为了帮助英语专业四级考生顺利通过语法与词汇关,作者根据《高校英语专业四级考试大纲(2004年新版)》,编写了《征服英语专业四级考试语法与词汇 2005 例》,作者在编写本书时,特别注意到以下两点。

勤学苦练, 题海大战 考场如战场, 若要百战不殆, 必须知己知彼。"彼"者, 题也。见识各种语法结构, 熟悉重点必考词汇, 道也。有"道"在胸,则可战无不胜。因此, 我们参考了过去 10 年中的英语专业四级考试、大学英语四级考试、大学英语六级考试、研究生人学英语考试的全真考题, 搜集了 2005 道语法与词汇考题, 企望读者藉题海战术, 在战斗中成长, 炼就不败金身, 成就战无不胜之真的英雄。
