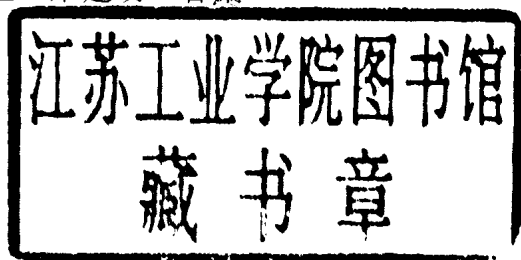

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前 言

学生用书全部是练习，教师用书包括录音文字和练习答案。本书主要内容包括新闻报道、采访谈话、报告和座谈等。内容丰富，题材广泛，既能提高听力，又能丰富知识。全书共配有录音磁带4盘。录音中有男声、女声以及英音、美音等，录音清晰，并保留背景声音，目的是为了使学习者熟悉不同环境中各种人说话的不同习惯和特点，因而具有较强的实用性。
