A medical anthropologist known for her work in sociology, social history, and public health, she has conducted research on infectious and chronic disease, gender, and sexuality in Southeast and East Asia and Africa as well as Australia, in the latter case with immigrant and indigenous women and Anglo-Australians. In 2001, Professor Manderson was awarded an inaugural Federation Fellowship by the Australian Research Council, and she is conducting a five-year research program on chronic illness, disability, social relationships, and well-being. She is a Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences in Australia and President of the International Association for the Study of Sexuality, Culture, and Society. Dr. Manderson has written several books, including Australian Women's Health: Innovations in Social Science and Community Research, Sickness and the State: Health and Illness in Colonial Malaya, 1870-1940, and Sites of Desire/Economies of Pleasure (with M. Jolly).
