Elvis Aaron Presley was born in Mississippi on January 8, 1935. When he was thirteen years old, his family moved to Memphis, Tennessee. Elvis loved music, so his mother bought him a guitar. He learned to play well. When he was nineteen years old, he made a recording of a song called "That's All Right, Mama" as a birthday gift for his mother. The studio manager liked Elvis's song. He gave copies of it to several radio stations.


Soon radio stations all over the United States were playing the song.

Young people loved Elvis's music from the very start. What was so special about it? His style was brand-new. It combined folk music, country music,



Elvis was not only a singer. He was also an actor. He made his first movie in 1956, and made a total of thirty-three films. Of course, he often sang in his films. Elvis was only forty-two when he died in 1977. In his lifetime, Elvis sold over a billion records, more than any other singer in history! He also had 18 records in the number-one spot. Today his records are still popular and thousands of fans visit "Graceland," his home in Memphis, every year. Elvis's rock and roll is here to stay!
