编者的话

阅读能力的测试是语言考试的一项重要内容。在各种英语考试试题中,例如托福考试(TOEFL)、英语水平考试(EPT),以及大学英语考试(CET),阅读理解(Reading Comprehension)题都占很大的比重。阅读理解题不仅份量重,而且还有时间限制。据统计,托福考试中的"词汇与阅读理解"要求考生在 45 分钟内读完大约 2 800 个单词的材料,并做完 60 道多项选择题;英语水平考试中的"词汇与阅读理解"则要求考生在 60 分钟内读完大约 2 900 个单词的材料,做完 60 道多项选择题;近几年来举行的大学英语考试四级试题中的"阅读理解"要求考生在 35 分钟内读完四篇短文,约1 500 个单词,并做完 20 道多项选择题。从以上数据可以看出:速度和准确,即阅读的流畅性和理解的准确性,对每位考生来说,都是很大的挑战。这两项指标也正是阅读课应该解决的一个矛盾。

阅读就是对书面材料信息的理解。对一篇文章的阅读理解不仅包括对该文章内的每一个词、每一个句子、每一个段落以及全文的理解,而且还包括对作者的意图、语气以及言外之意的理解。阅读理解能力实际上是一项综合能力。它既包括语言知识和阅读技能,又包括文化背景知识以及逻辑推理能力。所以,要提高阅读理解能力,以上几个方面都需要下功夫才行。

词汇和语法等语言知识是阅读理解的基础。要提高阅读理解 能力,当然需要打好语言知识这个基础。但是,只有语言知识还不 够,阅读技能也是阅读理解能力的一个组成部分,是提高阅读速度 的一个不可忽视的方面。

- 一般说来,阅读技能包括:
- 1. 从上下文中猜出生词的词意:
- 2. 找出篇章的主题大意;
- 3. 根据句子或段落的内容,进行正确的推理;
- 4. 批评性的阅读和鉴赏:

在英语考试试卷中,阅读理解题主要是围绕前三项技能的。本书的编写目的就是以阅读的三个主要技能,为读者提供一套系统的强化训练材料。

本书所选的段落、短文均选自近年来的原文资料,体裁多样, 题材广泛。书后附有参考答案,可供读者自测之用。

本书适合出国人员、研究生、有一定英语基础的大学生和自学者使用。

由于编者的教学经验和学术水平极其有限,书中定有不少缺点和错误,恳切地希望广大读者和专家们批评指正。

Context refers to the sentence or paragraph in which a word occurs.

The context clues we are looking for include; SYNONYM, ANTONYM, COMPARISON/CONTRAST, DEFINITION, APPOSITION/ RESTATEMENT, EXAMPLES AND SITUATION etc.

MAIN IDEAS

One of the most useful reading skills is being able to determine the main idea of a paragraph. Once you become adept at finding main idea, you will read faster and with better understanding.

In a single paragraph, a writer usually will present one main idea. And most sentences in the paragraph support, describe or explain the main idea of that paragraph.

The main idea of a paragraph is often—but not always—contained in the first or last sentence of that paragraph.

Sometimes it is only implied in the paragraph.

To find the main idea of any paragraph, the reader can ask three questions:

- A. Who or what is the paragraph about?
- B. What aspect of the who or what is the author concerned with?
- C. What does the author really want readers to understand about this aspect of the who or what?
