

The writer Thomas Keefe was born in Canada, but his family moved to the United States when he was six. The family first lived in Utah and then in Texas, where Keefe finished high school. After one year in college, Keefe joined the army for two years. When he returned, he went to Europe, where he worked as a foreign correspondent for World magazine from 1974 to 1978.



Keefe met his future wife, Englishwoman Anne Sanders, in Europe. The couple returned to the United States and were married in 1982. They have two children. They spent ten years in Pennsylvania, where Keefe wrote some of his best-known works. Keefe moved to California in 1993, when he was offered his present job at Stanford University. He is currently working on a book on California history, which he started in 1997.



How It's Done: Putting Soda in Cans



All soda is canned in much the same way. The process is quite simple and very fast. The Pepsi-Cola company, for example, produces 2,000 cans of soda in a minute. Here's how it works.

First, the design is printed on a flat sheet of aluminum. The aluminum is then cut and formed into empty cans, without tops. Next, the cans are put on flat trays, called pallets, which move on high-speed conveyor belts. Then the cans are turned upside down and sprayed with very hot water.

After this, the cans move into a filling machine, where they are filled with soda. In less than a second, another machine seals the cans tight. Once the cans are sealed, they are checked for quality. They are then packaged and delivered to customers all over the United States.
