Publisher's Note

Total Access to the Criminal Law of Canada

Volume 4 continues the revisions to the Eighth Edition of Crankshaw's Criminal Code wherein the **R.S.C. 1985 consolidation of the Criminal Code and related statutes** is fully intergrated into the publication. The first five volumes of this work are devoted to the Criminal Code, and the following two volumes to the related statutes. At the same time, the **caselaw has been fully updated** and many **important new features added** to this work. New larger binders are being provided to accommodate the growing body of caselaw and annotations and articles that have emerged in relation to the Criminal Code.

● **NEW CODE:** This new Volume 4, covering parts XX to XXII, **incorporates the 1985 consolidation of the Criminal Code** and any subsequent amendments. It also incorporates any enacted but unproclaimed sections of the Code. Your existing copy of Volume 4 based on the R.S.C. 1970 version of the Code can now be discarded.

● **UPDATED CASELAW:** This release also contains a **complete update** of the caselaw pertinent to Criminal Code provisions contained in Volume 4. The following parts are contained in this volume:

- Part XX Procedure in Jury Trials and General Provisions
- Part XX.1 Mental Disorder (replacing insanity provisions)
- Part XXI Appeals — Indictable Offences
- Part XXII Procuring attendance (subpoenas, warrants)

● **NEW FEATURES:** The incorporation of the R.S.C. 1985 has provided the opportunity to both **revise** the layout of this work and to **update, upgrade** and **expand** its principal components. This furthers Crankshaw's aim of giving you **total access** to Canadian Criminal law. Some of the major changes are as follows:

- **New Binders:** Post binders with **increased capacity**, clearly labelled with the Criminal Code Parts contained in each volume;

- **Text of the Code:** The text is **shaded** for ease of identification on the printed page. Amendments enacted but not proclaimed appear under the heading **PROPOSED AMENDMENT**;
 - **Detailed History of the Code:** Complete and **up-to-date** history beginning with the 1892 version of the Code (or the Burbridge Digest of 1889), including the **full text of the original section and all subsequent amendments**;
 - **Internal Cross-references:** All other Code sections, or other Acts mentioned in the text of a particular section are briefly described after the section for ease of reference;
 - **Related Sections/Related Statutes:** Related Code provisions and provisions of other statutes relevant to individual Code sections are listed following the relevant section with a topical note describing their content;
 - **Annotations and Articles:** An **expanded** bibliography of annotations and articles follow each Code section and are **cross-referenced to the digested caselaw**;
 - **Quantum of Sentence:** Criminal Code offence sections are cross-referenced to the relevant quantum digests in Nadin-Davis & Sproule, Canadian Sentencing Digest service;
 - **Divider Tabs:** Parts XX and XX.1 of the Code in Volume 4 have been subdivided by tabs into smaller units for easier access;
 - **Double Column Pages:** Utilized for reference material to permit more information to appear on each page;
 - **Supplementation:** Amendments to the Code will be **integrated into the text as soon as they are enacted** and will replace existing provisions when proclaimed. Regular supplementation will keep the caselaw and other components up-to-date.
