## **Ancient Egypt**

Travel back to a time over 4,500 years ago. You are in a land called Egypt. It is in the northern part of Africa. Here it is very hot and dry. Most people in **ancient** Egypt lived along the Nile River just as they do today.






▲ People have lived along the Nile River for thousands of years.




▼ Hieroglyphics 象形文字

One of the most amazing **creations** was the pyramid. It was a special kind of building. Each of the four sides of the pyramid was shaped like a triangle. The sloping sides came to a point at the top. This is the story of the greatest pyramid of them all.

### The Great Pyramid at Giza

- ▲ The largest pyramid ever built.
- A This is as tall as a 33-story building.
- ▲ Covers an area of about 7 city blocks.
- ▲ Built with over 2,300,000 blocks of stone.
- ▲ Each stone weighed over 2 tons.

# Why Did the Egyptians Build Pyramids?

The pyramids were tombs. Each was built to protect the body of a **ruler** of ancient Egypt. Ancient Egyptians believed that their spirit went on living in the land of the dead after they died. But to live forever, the spirit needed a body to rest in.



So, ancient Egyptians invented a way to preserve a dead body by making it into a mummy. The mummy of the dead ruler was **placed** in the pyramid.



▲ The mummy was kept in a secret room within the pyramid.

To make a mummy, ancient Egyptians followed a number of steps. First, they took out all body parts except the heart. Next, they dried the body out with a

special kind of salt. Then, they wrapped the body with many layers of cloth and covered the face with a mask. Finally, they placed the mummy in a wooden coffin, or box, shaped like a human body.

### Khufu

In ancient Egypt, the ruler was called pharaoh. The ancient Egyptians worshiped the pharaoh as a god on the Earth. They built pyramids for many pharaohs. The largest pyramid was built for the pharaoh Khufu, who ruled ancient Egypt over 4,500 years ago.



Khufu built his pyramid on the west side of the Nile River. Khufu began building his pyramid when he became pharaoh. He wanted to build the largest pyramid of all. He thought this would show he was the strongest ruler. Khufu's pyramid became known as the Great Pyramid at Giza.



## Who Built the Great Pyramid?

Building a pyramid took a long, long time.

It took 20 years or more to build the

Great Pyramid. Many experts think that as
many as 20,000 men helped to build it. Most of the workers
were farmers when they were not working on the pyramid.

### **The Farmers**

In ancient Egypt, most men were farmers. They lived and farmed along the Nile River. The Nile River **flooded** every year from June to September. The flooding helped make the soil along the Nile good for planting crops.

Egyptian farmers planted wheat and barley in the rich soil along the banks of the Nile River.
