### 写在荷面的话

杨惠中

随着我国英语学习的不断普及和深入,我国的英语教学法的重心亦由"语言输入 式"向"语言输出式"移位,即从单纯的领会能力教学转向综合的语言表达能力的培 养方面上来。

语言表达通常分为口语表达和书面表达两种形式,而口语是第一性的,是书面语赖以存在的基础。然而,过去我国的英语教学对学生的口语表达能力的培养缺乏足够的认识,亦未引起应有的重视,从而导致了学生口语能力不强,缺乏英语口头交际的能力,很难满足国家改革开放的形势的需要。这种现象业已引起了有关部门和社会的重视,一系列教学改革的举措相应陆续出台。确切地说,强化语言表达能力,特别是注重英语口语交际能力的培养已成为当前和今后一个时期我国英语教学的重点和发展方向。

上海译文出版社与美国Thomson Learning出版集团联手推出的《英语口语交际策略》,可谓弥补了这方面的需求之缺,它们为具有中级英语水平的学习者和广大英语爱好者提供一套原汁原味、纯正地道、不可多得的英语口语教科书。

《英语口语交际策略》分为基础篇和提升篇两部分,共计30个单元,每个单元均涉及到学习者关心、关注并感兴趣的鲜活话题。从婚姻到家庭,从工作到学习,从朋友到罪犯,从过去到将来,从信仰到代沟,从城市到乡村,从环保到健康,从旅游到运输,从经济到政治,从发展的世界到全球化等等,涵盖了生活、学习、工作的方方面面。

《英语口语交际策略》体例编排科学,新颖独特。基础篇旨在打牢基础,诱发口语交际兴趣;提升篇侧重于能力培养,提高口语交际技巧。单元结构也合理匀称,脉络清晰。从问题"预热"到词汇学习,从主要观点到个性表述,从问题讨论到语言实践,从组合搭配到巩固提高等,循序渐进,环环相扣。加之配套的教学指南和由外籍英语专家朗读的音带、CD等,无疑置学习者于英语口语交际的真实语境之中,寓学于说,寓教于乐。

《英语口语交际策略》文本中的语法点、熟语等疑难问题通篇加注, 搭配与句型中的词汇部分均列出了较为贴合例句的义项或常规义项, 便于读者查阅, 也充分体现了"以人为本"的理念。

《英语口语交际策略》原编著者 David Paul 先生是著名英语教育家,他编写的教材和创办的语言学校在国外颇有影响。我们相信,这套《英语口语交际策略》必将备受我国广大英语学习者,特别是大学低年级和大中专院校广大师生的喜爱。







### **POINTS OF VIEW - MONEY MAKES US GREEDY**



Money is the main cause of selfishness and stress in human relationships. It makes us greedy and competitive. I think we should all get paid the same amount of money. Each of us could then choose what to do with that amount. Some of us would spend it on vacations, some of us on our homes ...

It's not as simple as that. How about people who don't want to work? Should they receive the same amount? Money is an incentive to work. If everybody received the same amount, many people wouldn't work hard. And we need competition to encourage us to continually develop and improve society. It's human nature.





Money is not the only incentive to work. Some people work hard because they like the people they are working with, or because they believe in the social value of what they are doing, or even just out of a sense of responsibility. When we focus on ① money, we tend to forget about these other incentives, and the quality of our lives suffers.


