



《高端人物》丛书是在全社会学好外语迎奥运的热潮中从美国引进的 人物传记系列丛书。该套图书主要针对高中及大学在校生以及同等水平 的英语爱好者。

我们还邀请美籍专家对精彩片段进行了录音,配套的音频产品可以 在网上免费下载。这是英语阅读类图书中的一个创举,有利于同学们阅读与听力同步提高,互相促进。


《高端人物》丛书,语言纯正,是集阅读、听力为一体的不可多得的好书,将对学习英语的青少年朋友们大有裨益。

Introduction

Hillary Rodham Clinton¹ faced a big decision. The year was 1999. For more than six years, she had been First Lady of the United States — the wife of President Bill Clinton², a Democrat. She had lived in the White House with Bill and their daughter, Chelsea³. She had advised her husband on pressing political problems and defended him from political opponents. But Hillary Rodham Clinton was more than just her husband's helper. During Bill Clinton's presidency, she had met with famous world leaders. She had worked on important government projects. She had recommended major reforms of the nation's health care system. And long before her husband had become president, Clinton had had a distinguished career as a lawyer.

She was a powerful, intelligent woman who held an important place in American society. But with Bill Clinton's presidential term ending in early 2001, her job as First Lady would end as well. What would Hillary Clinton do afterward?

Many people wanted to hire her. She had job offers from colleges, big corporations, TV shows, and <u>charitable</u> organizations⁴. All these groups were eager to work with such a well-known and accomplished person with big-name connections in government. The Democratic Party wanted Hillary Clinton too. Democratic leaders began to ask: Would she consider running for the U.S. Senate? Daniel Moynihan⁵, a longtime senator from New York, had announced his upcoming retirement. Would Clinton consider running for his seat as a U.S. senator from New York in 2000?

At first, Clinton didn't take the idea seriously. After all, she wasn't a native New Yorker. She would have to move to New York before she could run for office there. She had never held elected public office before. And her Republican opponent was likely to be <u>Rudolph Giuliani</u>⁶, the popular New York City mayor. Even if Clinton were interested in the job — which she wasn't, she insisted — it seemed unlikely that she could beat Giuliani.

But the Democratic leadership wouldn't give up. One by one, prominent Democrats began to mention her name as their favorite candidate. Finally, Senator Moynihan himself added his support. He told an <u>NBC</u>⁷ correspondent that if Hillary Clinton were to run for the Senate, "She'd be welcome and she'd win."

Pressured by her fellow Democrats, Clinton agreed to at least consider the idea. On the negative side, she dreaded a long, exhausting political campaign. She knew the Republican Party was sure to launch <u>mean-spirited</u>⁸ campaign ads against her. And since she didn't yet live in New York, she knew she'd be called a <u>carpetbagger</u>⁹— an outsider who comes to a new area and meddles in its politics. Still, the idea of joining the U.S. Senate — the most powerful group of lawmakers in the United States — was tempting. Clinton thought it over. She talked about it with Bill and her close friends and advisers.

On March 4, 1999, Clinton was scheduled to speak to a group of young female athletes in New York City. Along with retired tennis champion <u>Billie Jean King</u>¹⁰, she was there to promote an HBO film called <u>Dare to Compete</u>¹¹, about women in sports. A teenage basketball player named <u>Sofia Totti</u>¹² introduced Clinton to the crowd. As Sofia shook Clinton's hand, she also whispered in her ear: "Dare to compete, Mrs. Clinton. Dare to compete."

Sofia's words hit home. After the event, Clinton realized that, like the young female athletes, she would dare to compete. She would run for the U.S. Senate. She later reflected, "All over the United States and in scores of countries, I had spoken out about the importance of women participating in politics and government, seeking elective office and using the power of their own voices to shape public policy and chart their nations' futures. How could I pass up an opportunity to do the same?"

The decision was made. After a "listening tour13"

to touch base with New York voters and a move to an old farmhouse in Chappaqua¹⁴, north of New York City, Hillary Clinton formally declared her candidacy in February 2000. In mid-May, at their state convention, New York's Democrats officially named her their candidate for the Senate. As her job as First Lady wound down, Hillary Rodham Clinton set forth into uncharted territory.
