



使用说明

本书是与《新英语教程——阅读》(第三版)第三、四册配套的补充练习册。由于教材中的练习多为主观型题,本练习册全部采用客观型的多项选择题,以满足教师和学生在教与学中的不同需要。本书包含两册,第三册有 10 套练习,第四册有 8 套练习,分别与教材中的各单元相对应。每套练习由三部分组成。

第一部分为阅读理解 (Reading Comprehension), 共 20 题, 用以检查对教材中的 Part A、Part BI、Part BII、Part BIII 各课课文的理解。

第二部分为词汇和语法结构 (Vocabulary and Structure), 共40题, 用以检查对教材中各课课文的词汇的掌握情况。

第三部分为完形填空 (Cloze),短文的题材与教材中的课文相近。文中可能会有少量生词,都有中文注释。要求填充的 10 个空中,实义词和结构词各占一定比例。此项练习有助于全面考核学生综合运用语言的能力。

每套练习为 100 分,既可用作学完一个单元后的测试题,也可在学习过程中选用相应部分作为课堂练习的补充或课外作业。书后附有全部练习答案。

本书各部分素材均选自原文书刊或词典,语言地道,内容丰富。 练习为作者自编。由于水平有限,一定有不少失误之处,敬请使用此 书的老师和同学指出,我们将在重印时改正。
