



The note "Le rire et la mort sont des produits comme le vitriol et le sucre" (Pist de la litt. angl., 4th ed., 1877, I, Introduction, p. xv) used as an epigraph for Théophile Gautier's "The equal Floor"; snark of the pretence kept up in Republican Rome "These disingenuous touches by which Augustus endeavoured to picture himself as no more than the first citizen of a free community" (Stuart Jones in the chapter "The Principals" in Cambridge Ancient History, ad 37 B.C. Bury, vol. X, p. 131).
Role not Paine & Sainte-Beuve in his capacity as chef de publicité at Hachette's.²⁸³ Published a year before the affair, since the *Etat de la médecine expérimentale*, Taine's *Portraiture* presents many points of similarity with Claude Bernard's work, & with the views subsequently expressed in Zola's *Le Roman expérimental*. Zola & Sainte-Beuve were content to remain deterministic yellow-branched. Whereas for


