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
前言

21世纪,国际交往日益频繁便利,现代交通工具的飞速发展、通信技术的更新换代和网络技术的全面运用将世界变成了"地球村"。 经济、信息、科技和犯罪的全球化使警务人员愈来愈多地参与涉外事件、案件的处理以及国际间的警务交流与合作。这势必对公安民警在从事涉外执法和服务等活动中的外语水平提出了更高要求。《实战警务英语》在这样的背景和需求下应运而生。

《实战警务英语》是针对涉外警务工作的特点和公安工作实际需要而编写的。教材设计围绕培养公安一线所需的应用型警务英语人才的目标,着力训练学生在各种警务工作情景下的英语语言交际能力,使学生能将学到的语言知识有效地转化为公安实战技能,较好地服务公安一线,圆满地完成涉外任务,同时对外树立良好的中国警察形象,使学生真正成为公安一线所需要的应用型涉外警务工作者。

全书共有十六个单元,每单元由五部分组成:情景会话;生词;短语词组;实用语句;口语操练。

情景会话 (Dialogues): 每单元由几个情景会话组成,内容围绕各单元实战主题,选用涉外警务交际中可能遇到的最具典型性的语言情



景和语言材料, 力求贴近各类真实的涉外警务工作, 创设仿真工作环 境,模拟真实工作程序,从不同角度展开会话,做到语言技能训练与 实际警务工作紧密结合, 使学生能够学以致用。

生词 (New Words): 以在课文中出现的次序排列, 释义使用中文, 力求简洁准确。为帮助学生扩大词汇,另补充了部分与单元内容密切 相关的实用单词。

短语词组 (Phrases and Expressions): 为加强学生运用英语的能 力,强化记忆,单独列出对话中出现的常见短语和专业短语,并配有 中文释义。

实用语句(Useful Sentences): 列出对话中出现的实用语句,并 配中文释义在先, 既训练学生的汉译英翻译能力, 又加强了记忆, 并 强化学习效果。同时补充了一些对话中未能安排的非常实用的句子, 以充实学习内容。

口语操练 (Speaking Practice): 每单元设有一项口语练习, 要求 学生就本单元学习内容自编自演一段情景剧, 为学生提供实际运用警 务英语的机会, 既能巩固所学语言知识, 又能增加学习趣味性。

此外。书后附录收录了情景会话中明确提到的三部相关法律内容 节选(《出入境管理法》、《刑事诉讼法》和《治安管理处罚法》)。 这些法律既是民警处理涉外案、事件的依据, 也是扩充警务英语词 汇、积累警务英语语言知识的规范性学习材料。

本书不仅适合用作公安院校警务英语口语课堂教学、也可用于在 职民警英语口语培训,还可用作广大民警自学手册,是值得公安院校 在校生和一线民警参考的英语工具书。

F: I've learned a lot, officer. Thank you very much.

P: You're welcome, Miss.

Dialogue 2 Giving Directions

P: Good morning. What can I do for you?

F: Good morning, Officer. I'm trying to find a post office.

P: Go straight ahead, then turn left at the second crossing and walk along for about 5 minutes. You'll find it on your left. You can't miss it.

F: Thanks a lot. One more thing, I wonder if you could recommend a local restaurant to me.

P: Sure. If you want to try local food, you can go to Shijiazhuang Restaurant, one of the best-known restaurants in this city.

F: Thanks for your help. Goodbye.

P: Enjoy yourself and have a nice trip around here.

F: Excuse me, sir. Is this the right way to the new railway station?

P: No, I'm afraid you're going in the wrong direction. The new station is

located in Qiaoxi District and it is a bit far from here.

- F: How far away is it from here?
- P: About half an hour's bus ride. You may take a bus at the stop over there, or take the subway, or just call a taxi.
- F: Where is the subway then?
- P: Go along this street for about 10 minutes and then turn right. You'll see the subway entrance there.
- F: Go along this street and then turn right. Got it, many thanks.
- P: You are welcome.

Dialogue 3 At the Railway Station

P: Which train, sir?

F: I'd like to buy a ticket to Qinhuangdao.

P: Do you have any special train in your mind?

F: No. How much is the ticket?

P: It depends on how you'd like to travel. A first class bullet (EMU) train ticket will cost you 206 yuan, and the second class 172 yuan; the travel time is 5 hours. If you want to take a normal fast train, 222 yuan for a soft sleeper, and 81 yuan for a hard seat; and the travel time is 9 hours.

F: Nine hours is too long! I'm afraid I can't afford the time.

P: It seems that you might like the bullet train then.

F: Yes, fine. I'd like a second class ticket.

P: D6602 departs at 11:45 and arrives in Qinhuangdao at 17:11. Is that OK?



F: Yes, just this one please.

2)

(A foreigner has lost his train ticket and is asking a policeman patrolling at the Railway Station for help.)

F: Excuse me, sir. I seem to have lost my train ticket. Should I buy another one?

P: Not really. What's your Train Number?

F: D6602 to Qinhuangdao.

P: I'll take you to the Dean's Window. She will help you. You will be asked to buy a new ticket at first, and then after you reach the destination you can get the refund at the ticket office there by showing the travel record signed by the train conductor. ... Show her your passport.

F: OK. How much should I pay now?

P: The same as you paid for the lost ticket, that is 172 yuan.

F: Oh, dear!

P: What's the matter, sir?

F: Where's my wallet? I can't find it. Someone must have stolen my wallet!

P: Perhaps it's in your other pocket.
