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复旦大学英语水平考试(FET)大纲(试行)

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一、考试性质

复旦大学英语水平考试(FET)是由复旦大学英语学院主持的英语水平测试,是该校英语专业及相关专业(如英语、翻译、商务英语等)的一个有机组成部分,旨在对学生英语应用能力进行客观评价。凡参加大学英语四级考试、六级考试、托福考试、雅思考试、其他外语(包括其他高校)考试的学生,均可报名参加。

二、考试目的

本考试的目的,是根据国家教委对高等学校英语课程的教学要求,全面测试学生的听、说、读、写、译的综合应用能力,为今后教学和科研提供参考,为学生毕业和就业提供依据。

复旦大学英语水平考试(FET)大纲 (试行)

前 言

复旦大学英语水平考试(FET)是根据原国家教委高教司“关于在八所高校进行大学英语教学改革试点工作的通知”的精神而设立的。

我国改革开放的不断深入和对外交往的日益扩大,对大学英语教学提出了更高的要求。为了适应新的要求,我们必须进行以打好语言基础、提高学生语言运用能力为目标的英语教学综合改革,而改进和完善英语测试则是综合改革的重要一环。为了比较全面地考核重点大学学生的英语水平,从而进一步推动重点大学的英语教学再上一个新台阶,我校决定设立复旦大学英语水平考试,并制定本考试大纲。

一、考试性质

复旦大学英语水平考试(FET)是与大学英语教学相结合的标准化测试,是我校大学英语基础阶段教学的一个有机组成部分,是评定学生英语成绩的重要依据之一。凡修读大学英语课程的本科生必须参加本考试,其他学生(包括其他高校的学生)也可自愿报名参加。

二、考试目的

本考试的目的是:根据原国家教委对重点大学英语课程的教学要求,全面测试学生听、说、读、写、译的英语综合运用能力,为评估重点大学的英语教学质量提供依据,为学生毕业求职或报考本校研究生提供英语水平证明。

三、考试内容

本考试包括四个部分: (一)听力理解; (二)阅读理解; (三)翻译与写作; (四)口语表达。前三部分为笔试, 题目按顺序统一编号。

本考试大纲的词汇表包含 8 000 个常用词及相关短语, 各部分试题所用词语不超过这一范围。

现将各部分试题的内容说明如下:

第一部分 听力理解 (Part I Listening Comprehension)

本部分包括两节, 共 20 题, 考试时间为 25 分钟。A 节 (Section A) 有 10 题, 分别安排在若干篇短篇对话之后, 每篇后设 2 至 4 题, 每题为一个问句。B 节 (Section B) 有 10 题, 分别安排在若干篇听力材料之后, 每篇后设有 2 至 4 题, 每题为一个问句。

听力部分的每个问句后有约 12 秒钟的间隙, 要求考生从每题四个选项中选出一个最佳答案。录音的语速为每分钟约 180 词, 只念一遍。

第二部分 阅读理解 (Part II Reading Comprehension)

本部分包括两节, 共 60 题, 考试时间为 55 分钟。A 节 (Section A) 为句子理解和词语用法, 有 30 题, 要求学生根据句意、词义及词的用法, 从每题四个选项中选出一个最佳答案。B 节 (Section B) 为篇章理解, 也有 30 题, 要求考生阅读若干篇短文, 总阅读量约为 2000 词, 超出词汇表范围的关键词可用汉语注明词义。每篇短文后设有若干问题, 考生根据所读短文的内容, 从每题四个选项中选出一个最佳答案。

第三部分 翻译与写作 (Translation and Writing)

本部分包括两节, 共 2 题, 考试时间为 60 分钟。A 节 (Section A) 为汉译英, 要求考生将一篇约 200-300 字的汉语短文译成英语。对译文的要求是: 通顺、达意、基本上符合英

语表达习惯,无比较严重的语言错误。B 节(Section B)为短文写作,要求考生根据所给题目和写作要求写一篇约 200 词的英语短文。对作文的要求是:文章切题、表达连贯、层次分明,文理通顺,遣词造句基本上符合英语表达习惯,无比较严重的语言错误。

第四部分 口语表达 (Part IV Oral Expression)

考生的笔试成绩必须达到优秀标准,才能参加口试。

口试包括三项内容:(一)朗读短文,要求考生用正确的语音、语调及意群停顿朗读所给短文的若干段落;(二)回答问题,要求考生用比较自然、流畅、规范的英语,根据所读短文内容回答若干问题;(三)即兴表达,要求考生就某一指定的主题,即兴用比较自然、流畅、规范的英语连贯地表达思想。口试的时间约为 10 分钟。

以上各部分试题的题型可根据实际需要作适当改变或调整,并事先通知考生。

四、答题、阅卷及计分方法

试卷一(Paper One)为客观性试题,要求考生从每题四个选项中选出一个最佳答案,答案做在答题纸(Answer Sheet)上。每题只能选择一个答案,多选作废。多项选择题只算答对的题数,答错不扣分,客观性试题用机器阅卷评分。

试卷二(Paper Two)为主观性试题,考生把答案直接写在试卷上,由阅卷人根据评分标准阅卷评分。

试卷(笔试部分)采用百分制记分,以 60 分为及格标准。试卷(笔试部分)的题目数、计分及考试时间列表如下:

五、考试日期

本考试暂定每年举行一次,笔试日期一般排在 6 月份。口试日期在笔试之后另行通知。

六、考试成绩及证书

本考试成绩达到及格标准后分成三个等级:(一)及格(笔试成绩 60-69.5 分,不参加口试);(二)优良(笔试成绩

70-84.5 分，不参加口试)；(三) 优秀 (笔试成绩 85 分以上，口试成绩 60 分以上)。

所有考生的成绩均以一定的百分比记入本人英语课程的总评成绩。只达到及格标准的不发证书；凡达到优良标准的发给复旦大学英语水平考试合格证书；凡达到优秀标准的在证书上注明“优秀”字样，其口试成绩以合格 (60 - 84 分) 或优秀 (85 分以上) 两个等级在证书上注明。
