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FOREWORD

The aim of this atlas is to enable students who want to know technical terms in English during their study of anatomy to improve their reading level in this field.

In this atlas there are 398 figures in all, most of them classical ones from the well-known books such as Gray's Anatomy (1975), П.Д. СИНЕЛЬНИКОВ'S АТЛАС АНАТОМИ ЧЕЛАВЕКА (1968), Strong and Elwyn's Human Neuroanatomy (1957), Frank H. Netter's The Ciba Collection of Medical Illustrations (Volume I, 1972) and others. Some of the other figures were designed by us according to the descriptions in the textbook Human Anatomy (1980) compiled by the China Medical University and 10 other medical colleges.

English terms have been adopted as much as possible except for those which can not be found in the original books. In these cases Latin terms have been used. At the end of the atlas there is an appendix of the terms in English and Chinese for cross-reference.

In a compilation of this kind, using several different languages, mistakes are unavoidable. Advice and suggestions are welcome.

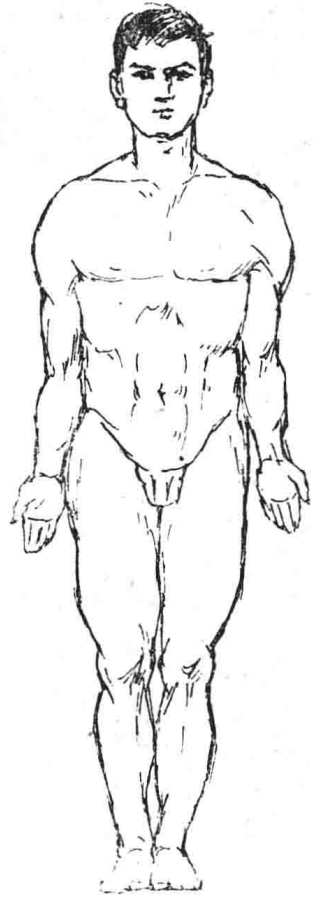


Fig. 1-1 The anatomical position.

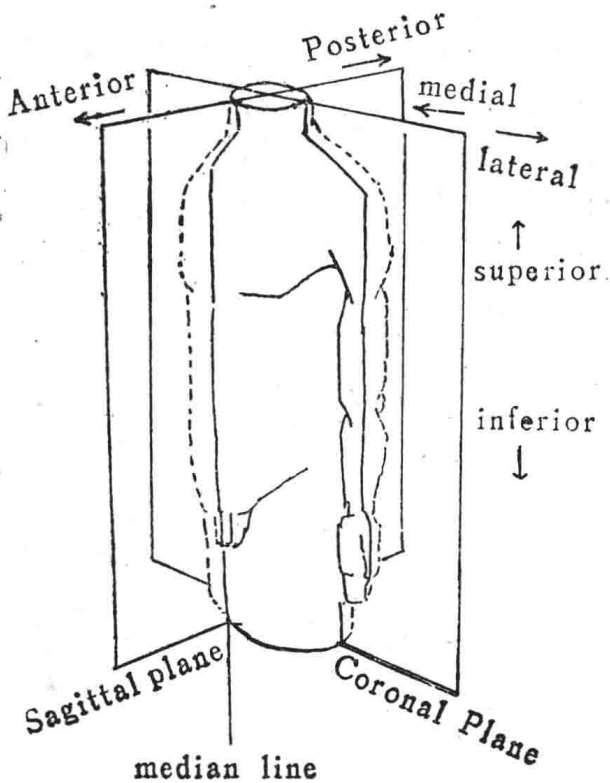


Fig. 1-2 Terms of planes and directions.
