
熟悉有难度的单词




Stanley Manners told lies. Not just little white lies, but big beastly whoppers.

"Stanley, will you please stop fiddling with the spoon and eat your cereal?" said Dad.


"I can't," replied Stanley. "The spoon is stuck to my nose because I have magnetic super

"Does this dress suit me?" asked Gran.


"Absolutely," replied Dad. "You look as pretty as a picture."

"If they can lie, why can't I?"




Stanley's birthday was getting close and he had invited his friends to his party.

"I got a robot for


my birthday and it can walk."
