前言

素有"北敦煌,南大足"美誉的大足石刻距今已有近千年的历史,大足石刻不仅为一处景点,也是我从小生活的故乡。大足石刻是中国石刻艺术中有规模、有价值、有艺术性的精美石刻造像。大足石刻创于晚唐、盛于两宋,以佛教造像为主,儒、道造像并存,是我国晚期石窟艺术的杰出代表作,它们生动形象地体现了先人巧匠在当时如此之高的技术和造诣!大足石刻的特色是造型极为贴近生活,即便是佛像也带有凡人的影子,同时隐约表现了中国宗教由"相互对抗"走向"相互融合"的趋势。

北山佛湾摩崖造像,开凿于唐代,龛窟密如蜂房,排开长达 500 多米,造像 5000 余尊。宝顶山石刻是中国罕见的大型佛教密宗石窟道场,石刻造像注重阐述哲理,兼收博采,显示了中国宋代佛学思想的特色。石篆山造像崖面长约 130 米,高 3 ~ 8 米。石篆山摩崖造像为典型的释、道、儒"三教"合一造像区,在石窟中罕见。石门山造像开凿于北宋,刻像崖面全长 71.8 米,其中有造像12 龛窟。妙高山山顶上原有古刹名寺,此处造像都为宋代所凿造,有一窟是释、道、儒合一造像。妙高山是典型的三教窟,在全国尤为珍贵。南山石刻造像属道教造像,明清两代稍有增补,此处摩崖造像一共有十五龛,都以道家作品为主。南山石刻造像是中国道教石窟造像最多、最集中、反映神系最完整的一处。

Preface

In the history of China, Dazu Grottoes can be traced back almost 1,000 years; it is as famous as Dunhuang Grottoes. For me, Dazu is not just a famous tourist attraction, it is my birthplace and hometown. Among all China's grottoes, the magnificent carvings in Dazu Grottoes are renowned for their large size and high artistic value. Dazu Grottoes originated in the late Tang Dynasty (875-907) and reached its peak during the Northern and Southern Song Dynasties (960-1279). Most of the stone carvings in Dazu are Buddhist statues, but there are also Confucius and Taoist statues; they are all outstanding examples of China's later period stone carvings; the carvings vividly show the personalities of the subjects, high carving technique and deep understanding of art. The artistic style of carvings in Dazu Grottoes has very close link to daily life. The statues of the Buddha reflect the characteristics of normal people and vaguely represent the trend of Chinese religions developing "mutual assimilation" from "mutual confrontation".

The cliff-side statues in Buddhist Bay of North Mountain began during the Tang Dynasty(618-907), number 5,000 along the 500-meter cliff. Seen from faraway, the caves are beehives. Baoding Caves is a large-scale Tantrict Buddhist site in China. The statues there extensively expound Buddhist philosophy and show the characteristics of the Song Dynasty's Buddhist philosophy. The statues in Shizhuan Mountain are carved on the front side of the cliff, which is 130 meters long and 3 to 8 meters high. The statues there are rarely seen in other grottoes of China and are a typical combination of Buddhism, Taoism and Confucianism. Shimen Caves, begun during the Northern Song Dynasty, has 12 statues carved on the front face of the 71.8 meter-long cliff. Formerly, there was an ancient temple atop Miaogao Mountain. The statues there were carved during the Song Dynasty; Miaogao Caves is very precious because it is the typical combination of Buddhism, Confucianism and Taoism. The statues in Southern Mountain are Taoist carvings; a few of them were carved during the Ming and Qing Dynasties (1368-1911). There are altogether 15 caves in the cliff and most of them are Taoist carvings. Southern Mountain Caves boast the most Taoist stone statues among China's grottoes. The Taoist statues there are also the most concentrated and represent the most complete Taoist sects.

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
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北山篇 North Mountain





北山北塔

北塔位于大足区龙岗山,建于南宋绍兴年间(1148~1155 年)。塔为砖砌,八角十二级楼阁式,高 30 余米。塔檐距离较小,内部为七层,通道置于塔心,拾阶而上可至塔顶。塔内外均有丰富的雕刻,塔外第一层八根角柱上雕刻有盘龙、力士像,塔内外壁雕有佛、菩萨、人物以及各种花木图案,是其他砖塔中少见的。北塔是大足人民的骄傲,每当逢年过节,都会有当地的居民自发地到此地游玩庆祝,在儿时的记忆中尤为深刻。过年不到北塔一游,便没有过年的感觉。

North Pagoda of North Mountain

North Pagoda is located on Longgang Mountain in Dazu District, Chongqing City. It was built between 1148 and 1155 AD during the Southern Song Dynasty(1127-1279). The pagoda's main structure of bricks has 8 sides and 12 stories; the pagoda is more than 30 meters high. There are many sculptures on its interior and exterior walls. Entwining dragons and warriors are carved on the 8 corner columns of the first floor; the Buddha, Bodhisattvas, laymen, flowers rees, rarely seen in other brick pagodas, are carved on the exterior wall.

北山北塔下的二佛 位于北山寺外,凿刻于 晚唐。二佛造像雕刻精 细、艺精技绝,是难得 的佛教艺术珍品。这北 塔下面的二佛,是我在 小学开始学画时经常写 生的对象,现在看来, 是那样的俊美典雅,令 人想起很多美好回忆。

Two Statues of the Buddha at North Pagoda of North Mountain

The two statues of the Buddha outside North Mountain Temple were carved during the late Tang Dynasty (875-907). Intricately carved and decorated, they are rare Buddhist art treasures.

北山佛湾一角

北山佛湾位于北山石刻景区,此处摩崖造像近万尊主要集中在公元9世纪末至12世纪中叶(晚唐、五代、两宋)建造完成。北山石刻造像具有人物个性鲜明、体态优美、比例匀称、穿戴艳丽等特点,且多保存完好,宛如新刻,被公认是"中国石窟艺术皇冠上的一颗明珠"。

Buddhist Bay of North Mountain

The Buddhist Bay of North Mountain is located in the North Mountain Cliffside Inscription Scenic Site. There are almost ten thousand statues here mostly made between the end of the 9 century AD and the middle of 12 century, the period between the late Tang, Five Dynasties, Northern Song and Southern Song.




北山韦君靖像

韦君靖像位于北山佛湾内,凿刻于唐代。相传北山石刻是由唐代韦君靖倡导建成的,有碑言:"金紫光禄大夫,检校司空,使持节都督昌州诸军事守昌州刺史、充昌普渝合四州都指挥、静南军使,兼御史大夫,上柱国、扶风县开国男,食邑三百户韦君靖建。"

Statue of Wei Junjing of North Mountain

The statue of Wei Junjing was created in the Buddhist Bay of North Mountain during the Tang Dynasty (875-907). It is said that Wei Junjing is the one who proposed making the North Mountain Cliffside Inscription.



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
