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进入21世纪,我国经济和社会的发展日新月异,对外语人才的要求不断提高。外语教育也随着经济和社会的发展,在教学目标、教学模式、教学手段等方面发生着巨大变化。无论是修订后的《高等学校英语专业英语教学大纲》,还是《大学英语课程教学要求》,都要求培养出来的学生具有较高的英语综合应用能力,并对学生的英语交流能力、尤其是口语交际能力提出了更高的要求。

口语交际能力的提高离不开好的口语教材。外教社在自主研发口语教材的同时,也积极寻求国际上能够符合我国教学实际需要的好教材,希望国外教材的引进能为我国师生提供更多的选择,从而促进我国英语口语教学的发展。经过广泛比较和调研,外教社于2007年引进了英国著名教育出版机构——麦克米伦出版公司的全球畅销教材 Inside Out(《流畅英语口语教程》)。该套教材经过教学实践充分检验,深受世界各地学习者的欢迎。外教社结合国内教学实际,对之做了整合和改编,用于高校英语口语课堂。出版5年来,该套教材赢得了使用高校的一致好评,为英语专业和大学英语学生英语口语能力的提高做出了极大的贡献。

随着时代的发展,我国大学英语教学环境发生了变化。社会对人才的需求进一步提升,学生进校的英语水平较之前几年有了提高,这些都对英语教材的与时俱进提出了要求。鉴于此,外教社根据新的需要,于2012年隆重推出《流畅英语口语教程》第二版,希望修订后的新教材能在新时期继续发挥它的作用。

该套教材有以下优点:

- 1. 每单元话题经充分调研筛选而成,涉及日常生活的各个领域,让不同层次、不同兴趣的学生均能有话可说,从而最大限度调动学生的参与积极性。
- 2. 采用让学生从知识和情感两方面充分"参与"的教学策略。供学生听、读和讨论的材料与生活密切关联;练习的设计互动性和开放性很强,鼓励学生讲述真人真事,从而激发学生的交流欲望,有效提高口语表达的流利度。
- 3. 在全面训练英语技能的基础上发展学生的英语交际能力。口语训练与阅读、视听、语法、词汇等内容紧密融合",相辅相成,区别于国内传统口语教材。教师可以根据课时安排和学生水平有选择地使用这些内容。
- 4. 教材作者均为资深英语教学专家,有在世界各地教授英语的经历。教材融入了丰富多彩的各国文化,体现着浓郁的地域风情。学生在学习过程中,可以将别国文化与中国文化相联系,并通过比较、思考,提高对文化差异的辨别力,从而增强跨文化交际能力。
- 5. 作者奉行让学生在轻松愉悦中学习英语的教学理念。教材中风趣幽默无处不在,大到一篇文章,小到一个句子、一幅图片、一张漫画,不时让人开怀一笑,大大增强了学习效果。
- 6. 教材配有Multi-Rom, 含录音和视频, 用生动的题材、丰富的体裁、多样化的语言素材, 为学生提供了生活中英语运用的真实例子, 训练学生对日常英语的听力技能, 增强他们用英语交际的自信。

- 7. 供选用的练习册可帮助学生复习单元所学要点,提供更多的听力练习和语音练习,以帮助学生全面提高英语能力,更好地打好口语基础。
- 8. 教学资源丰富。教师用书包含授课指南、文化背景和语法、词汇解释、录音文字、练习答案、课堂活动及使用指南,并配有测验CD,内含多套试卷及录音;配套网站www.insideout.net不仅为教师提供了丰富的教学资源,还为我国教师创建了一个与世界各地教师交流的平台;网站上的e-lesson每周更新,可用作教学补充材料。

与第一版相比, 第二版做了如下改进:

- 1. 替换了在部分学生看来比较私密敏感的话题, 更益于学生开口交流。
- 2. 增强了对语法、词汇及功能性语句的学习,更利于学生将语言内化,流畅交谈。
- 3. 更新了超过50%的图片和材料,典型性、适用性、时代性更强。
- 4. 各板块增加说明性标题, 明确训练项目或技能, 使结构一目了然。
- 5. 增配了Multi-Rom光盘,含互动式内容及视频片段,针对学生用书提供更多练习和复习。
- 6. 教师用书加强了对文化、语言差异,语法、词汇知识的介绍和解释;改用双色印刷, 增加教师使用时的愉悦感。

《流畅英语口语教程》 (第二版) 为学生设置了有吸引力的话题、真实的语境、丰富的内容、新颖的课堂活动,能够充分唤起学生学习英语的兴趣,使学生通过吸收丰富的语料,快速提高听说能力,深入了解各国文化和社会知识,有效培养他们的英语交际能力。

相信《流畅英语口语教程》(第二版)的推出,能在继承和发扬第一版优点的基础上,为 我国英语学习者英语口语能力的提高发挥更大的作用。

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



The psychology of personal ads

Imagine that you want to write a personal ad. What choice of words do you think would attract the largest number of replies? (1) ____ Men tend to look for women who are physically attractive, understanding and athletic. In contrast, women are searching for someone who is understanding, humorous and emotionally healthy.

Psychologist Richard Wiseman decided to look at personal ads another way. (2) ____ He asked the question: which type of ad would entice the greatest number of replies – the one that describes you in greater detail or the one that describes the person you are looking for?

To find out, he looked at a large number of personal ads and counted the number of words that each person had used to describe themselves, and the number used to describe the type of person they were looking for. (3) ____ First of all, there were the people who said very little about themselves and focused almost entirely on their wish list. Then there were the people who divided the words more evenly, describing both themselves and their potential partner. Finally, there were the people who focused almost entirely on themselves.

(4) ____ He showed the ads to over one hundred men and women and asked them to say which ones they would reply to. Only a small number of people said that they found the 'it's all about you' ads appealing. The 'it's all about me' ads did a little better, but still didn't tempt many replies. (5) ____ The most successful ads had a balance of 70 per cent 'this is me' and 30 per cent 'this is what I'm looking for'.

The research also provided one very useful piece of advice for anyone who is thinking of writing an ad. For the ads that were written by men, other men were able to predict which ads would appeal to women. But for the ads written by women, it was a different story.
