REVIEW YOUR ENGLISH is a series of lessons on recorded tape designed to help you review and improve your knowledge of English. We assume you have already studied English in school or in your spare time with a tutor. Perhaps you have studied English for one year, perhaps for a number of years. But everyone can profit from a review of the basic grammar of a language. This Listener's Guide for REVIEW YOUR ENGLISH will assist your study by providing you with a variety of material to illustrate each lesson.

In this series you will have plenty of opportunity to listen to English spoken correctly, as well as to speak it yourself. You will be asked to listen and repeat what you hear, and respond in other ways, too—answering questions and participating in drills and in conversations. Often you will be helped to know whether your response is right or wrong because you will hear a voice on the tape giving the correct response.

As you listen to the lessons, please follow along in your Listener's Guide. Be sure you are looking at the right page. Sometimes you will see the word Optional on the side of the page. This means that part of the lesson printed in this Listener's Guide may possibly not be on the recorded tape you are listening to. If it is not, turn over the page to the next new material and continue studying.
