Preface

The introduction in 1996 of the Community trade mark (CTM) brought into being a new and independent trade mark system with its own sources of law, its own procedures, and its own administrative and judicial bodies. Today, the case law of OHIM (including its Boards of Appeals), the EGC and the ECJ is absolutely central to Community trade mark law, including the trade mark laws of the Member States.

The practice of the EU bodies is often complicated and a massive number of decisions exist. Central for the focus of this book is to scrutinize, explain and categorize the case law in particular of the ECJ and the EGC. Especially in areas where there is no or limited case law from the courts in Luxembourg, references are made to the practice of OHIM, particularly decisions from the Boards of Appeal.

The book is written by practising attorneys for the benefit of company lawyers, attorneys, trade mark attorneys and anyone else dealing with trade mark law, whether on a Community level or nationally. Our chosen focus is the substantive aspects of Community trade mark law, and the book, therefore, does not offer a general introduction to national systems of trade mark law and deals only to a limited extent with the registration aspects of Community trade mark law. The focus remains also on issues of practical relevans for practitioners, and consequently the book does not embark upon theoretical interesting, but in practical life less important, discussions.

For the sake of clarity, we will often refer only to the Trade Mark Regulation, even when dealing with preliminary references which concerns the Trade Mark Directive, as the material provisions remain similar.

Work is currently ongoing for a revision of the Trade Mark Regulation and the Trade Mark Directive. This book contains, in section §1.06, an overall description of the current stage of these preparations and of the most significant changes. The changes are described in more detail in connection with the discussion of the relevant provisions.

Case law and literature are updated as at 15 August 2015.
