PREFACE

Criminal Law: A Comparative Approach is a criminal law text written from a comparative perspective, featuring cases and materials on the central issues in criminal law from two representative common law and civil law jurisdictions, the United States and Germany.

The idea for this book emerged from several years of searching for a format that allows teachers and scholars to unlock the potential of comparative analysis. *Criminal Law: A Comparative Approach* does not attempt to present an encyclopedic overview of the world's criminal law systems.¹ It is both narrower and deeper in conception; it presents a systematic and comprehensive comparative analysis of the substantive criminal law of two jurisdictions, covering both the fundamental principles of the so-called general part and a selection of offenses drawn from the so-called special part of criminal law.²

The present book, then, is about criminal law first, and about comparative law second. Its primary audience is criminal law scholars and teachers interested in a deeper understanding of their own field, not card carrying comparativists. It presupposes no familiarity with either U.S. or German criminal law—or with any other criminal law system, for that matter.³ All foreign-language sources have been translated into English.⁴ Cases and materials are accompanied by heavily cross-referenced introductions and notes that place them within the framework of each country's criminal law system and highlight issues ripe for comparative analysis. Throughout, readers are exposed to alternative approaches to familiar problems in criminal law, and as a result will have a chance to see “their” country's criminal law doctrine, on specific issues and in general, from the critical distance of comparative analysis.

The bulk of the materials is drawn from U.S. and German criminal law; materials from other jurisdictions, common and civil, have been included where appropriate—notably from Canadian criminal law, which has come to occupy an intermediate position between common law and civil law approaches in general, and between U.S. and German criminal law in particular. Of course each reader is free—and, in fact, encouraged—to adapt the text to her needs, by highlighting and exploring contrasts and comparisons with her domestic criminal law system.

² The book is yet narrower, in another sense: Rather than trying to capture “American criminal law” in its entirety (consisting of over fifty jurisdictions), we focus on the Model Penal Code. The Model Penal Code was drafted by the American Law Institute, an influential law reform organization, between 1952 and 1962, under the direction of Professor Herbert Wechsler, with the assistance of a cast of collaborators, which included law professors, lawyers, and judges, as well as psychiatrists, a criminologist, and a professor of English. The Model Penal Code triggered widespread reform in American criminal law, remains the most systematic statement of American criminal law, has been called “the principal text in criminal law teaching,” and—as a code—is particularly well suited for comparative analysis with civil law systems. The comparative study of criminal law thus can lay the foundations for critical analysis not only of another system or systems, but also of one's own. Taking a comparative perspective facilitates a more nuanced analysis of the criminal law system familiar to a given reader, both at the specific level of individual criminal law doctrines and at the general level of the two representative systems as a whole. This enhanced understanding of one's "home" system may lead to a more critical engagement with, and appreciation of, specific features of that system along with its conceptual and historical foundations.

Beyond the realm of domestic criminal law systems, a comparative view of criminal law is conducive to the study of international criminal law. This rapidly emerging field, still in the early stages of its development, has relied heavily on a comparative analysis of domestic systems of criminal law, both in the scholarly literature and in the growing jurisprudence of international criminal courts.

To unlock its considerable potential, domestic and international, comparative criminal law must take a comprehensive and contextual approach that enables rich comparative analysis, rather than collect point-by-point contrasts or make grand but vague statements about essential systemic distinctions and similarities. Ideally, in criminal law scholarship, doctrinal comparison will be placed within a broad historical and extra-legal context, and will reflect the necessary sensitivity to the difference between "law in the books" and "law in action." In criminal law teaching, we ordinarily do not have the luxury to fill in quite as much of the conceptual and empirical framework as we might in scholarship, except perhaps in upper-level seminars of sufficiently narrow topical focus. The present book nonetheless draws on what we hope is a suitably rich body of primary and secondary materials on two major criminal law systems that makes meaningful and rewarding comparative analysis possible, adjusting the resolution of our comparative lens as appropriate to find a happy medium between generality and specificity, the forest and the trees. Similarities at the level of general doctrine will go hand in hand with differences in detail, while differences in general approach may, upon closer inspection, make less of a difference on the ground than might first appear.

It is tempting, in this preface, to attempt to trace grand themes that run through this book, and to try in broad strokes to set out a general comparative analysis of common law and civil law systems of criminal law, or at any rate of U.S. and German criminal law, but it is a temptation we will resist. Developing and discarding, then reviving and constantly revising hypotheses on the subject of systemic comparison will be among the chief pleasures of reading and working through the book, or so we hope.
