Preface

This edition of *Current Therapy* is the thirty-second of an annual series devoted to bringing the latest concise and authoritative information on current treatment to the practicing physician. The format and editorial policies of previous editions have been continued in accord with the wishes of the contributors and the physicians who use this book.

It is assumed that the physicians using this volume have intimate knowledge of the detailed information available in the manufacturer's official publications for each drug before prescribing the drug for their patients. The therapeutic action of most drugs mentioned is under continuous clinical evaluation, and from time to time new uses, changes in dosage, the appearance of unexpected contraindications, and adverse reactions are reported. Official announcements and official product circulars should be followed to keep abreast of these changes. Sometimes a larger dosage than that usually recommended is advised for patients under exceptional circumstances or in cases of serious or life-threatening illness. In these instances the use of a dose or drug becomes a matter of the physician's own clinical judgment and depends on knowledge obtained by consulting official drug information sources.

Each year *Current Therapy* is essentially a new book. In this edition 90 per cent of the articles

are new and all of the articles carried over from the previous edition have been reviewed and revised as needed by the authors.

A correct diagnosis is assumed to have been made before the book is consulted, although in some instances a brief definition or discussion of diagnosis may be given if in the opinion of the authors it is necessary.

The term "method of" as used in this book refers to the regimen in use by the author-clinician; it does not necessarily imply that the author was the originator of the regimen. Current treatment is a summation of the work of many clinicians over the years. Traditional therapy, if the author considers it to be the best available, is included along with modern advances.

The editor wishes to thank the contributors and consultants for their invaluable assistance; the greatest share of credit for the success of this book must be given to them. The editor also wishes to express his appreciation to the staff of the W. B. Saunders Company for their wise guidance and continued interest and to Mr. C. F.
