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Professor Dr. T. Treu (born 22 August 1939), graduated from the University of Milan with a degree in law (November 1961). He was assistant professor of labour law at the same university until 1968 and Harkness Fellow at Cornell University's School of Industrial and Labour Relations and at the University of Chicago Law School from 1962 to 1964. He was certified as a professor of labour law in 1968 and selected, in the same year, to teach labour law at the University of Pavia (Law Department) and the Catholic University (Economics Department). He was tenured professor of labour law from 1971 to 1988 at the University of Pavia (Law Department); from 1988, full professor at the Law

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In 1993 Professor Treu was Director of ARAN, the Agency for the Representation in Negotiations of the Public Administration, sponsored by the Italian Prime Minister's Office – Department of Public Services. From January 1995 to October 1998 he was Minister of Labour and Social Security, from October 1998 to December 1999 Minister of Transport in the Italian government.

In 2001 he was elected to the Italian Senate. From 2006 to 2008 he was President of the Senate Committee on employment and welfare. From 2008 to March 2013 he was vice president of the same committee. From 2013 to 2015 he was a member of CNEL (the National Council for Economy and Labour).

He is the author of numerous essays and books on labour law, union law and industrial relations, both Italian and comparative.

Author's note

This edition of the encyclopedia monograph Italy is updated to 31 December 2015. This volume has undergone a major revision, because during the year 2015 a set of very important reforms, usually referred to as the Jobs Act, was approved by the Italian Parliament.

Act 183/2014 has delegated the government to approve several decrees (eight) regulating many aspects of the law of employment contracts and of the labour market. These decrees have in fact reshaped a great part of the previous legislation on these matters.

All the major innovations are analysed in the text. Essential information is given about the most important regulations of the past commented on in the previous editions of the monograph, insofar as they are useful to understanding the history and the precedents of the present legislation.

The eight decrees implementing Act 183/2014 have been approved and became effective in 2015. The list is as follows:

- Decree 22/2015 on unemployment benefits and systems of replacement;
- Decree 23/2015 on contracts of employment for an indefinite period;
- Decree 80/2015 on work life balance, conciliation measures, parental leave and other provisions on maternity;
- Decree 81/2015 on revision of various types of employment contracts and of the law concerning job mobility;
- Decree 148/2015 on provisions and benefits in case of lay-off and suspension of the employment contract;
- Decree 149/2015 on the simplification and rationalisation of labour inspections;
- Decree 150/2015 on the reform of placement services and of active labour policies, the national employment agency, the bonus for replacement, revisions to the system of incentives;
- Decree 151/2015 on the simplification and rationalisation of employment procedures, of norms on work accidents and on maternity provisions; revision of sanctions.

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
