

#### EMERGING CONCERNS AND PROBLEMS

#### Deteriorating standards

There is a growing feeling that teacher-training courses are not effective in turning out effective teachers. The reasons for this inadequacy of training and deteriorating standards are as:

Proliferation of institutions increased tremendously. B.Ed. through correspondences and part time/Vacation courses.

Teacher training has been more commercialized than professionalized.

The physical facilities and teaching staff of training institutions are not adequate.

Admissions are not made by taking into consideration the employment opportunities available to the teachers of various category.

The courses of study are theory oriented and outdated and do present day needs.
