讀書貴精不貴多，準備托福字彙亦然。市面上有許多托福字彙的書籍，列出上萬個單字。即使學習英文多年的人，也得花下日積月累的工夫，才能全部熟記，更何況想要在短時間通過托福的考生。因此許多人買回家以後就束之高閣，根本無法產生實際的效果。

有鑑於此，我們著手編輯「托福常考字彙」，採用美國電腦統計的最新資料，精選托福考試中最常出現的單字。我們的目標就是讓買這本書的人能確實閱讀，使這些單字不但幫助您通過托福考試，並且成爲您的一部分，日後更能靈活運用。

blunder ['blʌndə] *n.* 大錯誤 (= big mistake)

I think that I committed a **blunder** in asking her because she seemed very upset by my question.

我想我犯了一個大錯，我不該問她，因為她似乎被我的問題弄得很煩亂。

blush [blʌʃ] *v.* 臉紅 (= flush)

She always **blushes** when she is embarrassed. 當她受窘的時候，她總是臉紅。

bombard [bom'bərd] *v.* 砲轟

Our ships **bombarded** their fortress. 我們的戰艦砲轟他們的砲台。

boulder ['boldə] *n.* 大的鵝卵石

The crew was able to haul away the smaller rocks, but there are still some **boulders** at the construction site which were too heavy to move without bigger equipment. 這羣工人可以拖走較小的岩石，但是建造地點

上仍有一些大的鵝卵石，它們太重了，沒有較大的裝備無法搬動。
