When you buy a suit or jacket, give the size number and tell whether you want a short, regular, or long jacket. For example: Figure A in the drawing might buy a "36 short." When you buy a shirt, give the collar size first and then the sleeve size. For example: Figure B might buy a "14½-30." When you buy shorts or slacks give the waist* size. For example: Figure C might buy a "Size 40." When you buy shoes, give the length, and width*. The number tells the length. The letter tells the width. For example: Figure B might buy a "9 D."

Sizes 6 to 18 are "Misses Sizes." These are usually for older women. Sizes 5 to 15 are "Junior Sizes." These are usually for younger women. For example: An 18-year-old medium-sized woman might buy a "Size 11" dress. A small woman over 35 might buy a "Size 8" dress. When you buy shoes give the length and width. For example: Figure E might buy a size "7 B" shoe and Figure D might buy a "5 A." Sweaters usually come in small, medium, or large.

If you have any questions about your size, ask the salesperson.
