Section B





Football Games

There are two popular sports in the world which share the name "football". The game known to most of the world as football is also called **soccer**; the other game is American football, a sport which is best known in the United States. In both games two opposing teams compete to possess and move a ball. In soccer a point is scored for a team when the ball enters the opposing team's goal which is usually marked by posts backed with netting. In American football there are several ways for a team to score points; six points are awarded when a player possesses the ball in his opponent's end zone, a ten yard deep area at either end of the one hundred and twenty yard football field. Scoring in this way is called a "touchdown".







In soccer players usually contact and move the ball by kicking it, in some cases a player might use his head to deflect an airborne ball, only a single player on each team, the **goalkeeper**, is permitted to handle the ball with his hands. In American football players may throw and kick the ball and can run while carrying it. Unlike in soccer, playing on the football field is often started and stopped, the periods during which players handle and move the ball are called "downs". In American football the team which possess the ball is the offense, only the offensive team can score a touchdown.
