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## 前 言

《现代大学英语(精读)》(外语教学与研究出版社)是由北京外国语大学英语系编写的一套供大学英语专业学生使用的精读教材。在使用过程中,广大师生普遍反映起点高、难度大。为了帮助广大师生及英语自学者更好地学习和理解这套教材,我们组织了6所高校具有丰富教学经验的教师精心编写了这套《现代大学英语(精读)全程辅导》(1~6册)。

本套书的编写是在透彻理解和准确把握国家教育部最新颁布的《高校英语专业教学大纲》和《高校英语专业四、八级考试大纲》精神的基础上进行的,全套书力求全方位、多角度、大容量地诠释《现代大学英语》教材的词汇、句型、课文、练习等内容。本套书讲解细致、透彻、准确,设计科学、合理,使用方便,助考得力。

本套辅导与教材同步,每课由Text A 和 Text B 两部分组成。Text A 包括以下五部分:

### 一、课文导读

(一) 内容梗概:从全局的角度简洁概述 Text A 的课文大意,剖析作者的观点和写作目的,以帮助学生学习和理解课文。

(二) 背景知识:介绍与课文相关的典型背景知识,帮助学生透过语言材料了解与课文有关的人物、事件、地理、文化、政治、社会等知识,拓展知识面。

### 二、词汇与短语

(一) 词汇:注有音标、词性、英汉释义、重要词语的同义词、反义词、派生词,以帮助学生更好地理解词义。对于重要词汇列出其常用的词义,并在每个义项后配以例句及译文。

(二) 短语:对课文中出现的重要短语给以英汉释义及例句,以帮助学生加深对短语要点的理解。

### 三、课文注释

对课文中出现的语言要点加以英汉解释;对典型语言点加以归纳总结;对语言理论加以简洁、实效的介绍;对难句加以结构分析,解决对语言背景、修辞手段、写作意图、写作风格等理解的问题。

### 四、课文译文

给出课文的参考译文,便于学生理解文章、认清结构、明确主题,从中学到语言知识,提高理解与运用的能力。

## 五、练习答案及详解

对阅读、理解、词汇、语法等进行准确的详解、总结及示例，帮助学生准确掌握知识，突破难点。

Text B 包括课文译文及同步测试两部分：课文译文便于学生从宏观角度分析篇章结构，同步测试从主旨、词汇、细节、理解等多方面加深学生对课文的理解。

在本套书的编写中，我们得到了有关专家的热情指导和大力帮助，美国专家 Bob. M. Livingston 审阅了书中的英文部分，在此我们深表谢意。

我们相信，本套书对学生准确把握教材内容，提高自身英语素养并顺利通过英语专业四、八级考试会大有裨益，希望本套书能成为广大师生的良师益友，也希望广大读者提出宝贵的意见和建议。

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# Lesson One

Text A

Thinking as a Hobby



## 一、课文导读

### (一) 内容梗概

这是英国著名寓言小说家、1983年诺贝尔文学奖获得者威廉·戈尔丁所写的一篇随笔。

作者结合自身思维习惯的养成过程，将思维分成三个等级，认为一级思维是一种理想的完整的思维方式，然而曲高和寡，因为真理有时掌握在少数人的手里；二级思维指那些缺乏主见的人云亦云者；而三级思维则讥讽那些高谈阔论、口是心非者，并对形形色色的伪善者进行无情地鞭挞，文中提及的霍顿先生便属此类。

作者文笔洗练，语言辛辣、犀利，讽刺性极强。作者在文中还积极探索了人与社会的关系。该文无论是在知识性、思维性，还是语言技巧的应用上都别具一格。

### (二) 背景知识

#### 1. Venus statue

The ancient Venus statue is also known as the Aphrodite goddess. The original goddess Venus statue can be found in Paris at the Louvre Museum. Venus De Milo Aphrodite was carved by the sculptor of Antioch on the Maeander River at about 150 BC and it was only later rediscovered. In the goddess Aphrodite's son was named Eros in Greek Mythology for the Greeks and Cupid, the god of love and sexual desire and the messenger of love, in Roman Mythology. To this day the Venus statue remains a sculptural masterpiece with few equals.

#### 2. Leopard statue

The lonely leopard statue is near Hout Bay, which is located on the western side of the Cape Peninsula. The famous *bronze leopard statue* stands on the rocky outcrop at the foot of Chapman's Peak Drive, facing the mouth of Hout Bay harbour. It commemorates these animals that freely roamed the Hout Bay Mountains as recently as the 1930s. It was a gift to the people of Hout Bay from sculptor Ivan Midford—Barberton, the statue has been guarding the bay and facing the elements since March 1963.


#### 3. Rodin's Thinker

It is the most famous piece of art by the French sculptor August Rodin in 1917. It is said to be the statue that most clearly shows the abstract idea of thought or thinking. "The Thinker" is pondering so intensely that even his toes are tightly clutching the ground. Rodin often portrayed strong contrasts, as is shown by this sculpture, such as the finished figure combined with the unfinished marble on which he

is seated. The original is now on display at the Metropolitan Museum of Art.
