每本书都是从Week1/Monday开始,每课5个新词,每周学习5课, 共计40周。对于有一定基础的同学,我们建议这五个部分同时学习。每 天记住20个新词,周六、周日将这一周所学内容来一个总复习。本系 列词汇书所选词汇均是出国考试中出现频率最高的词汇,相信大家在学 习的同时会发现自己做考试真题的正确率及速度正逐渐提高。

使用方法:

第一,建议先从每课的练习部分开始。先做练习,看看自己哪个单词掌握得不准确,哪个单词一点不会,标出来,作为学习时的重点。

第二,回到第一部分"Word List",参考 [助记法],熟记每个词的释义,注意按照音标正确地发音。

第三. 熟记每个单词的练习部分"英英对照"及"句子填空"。熟记"英英对照"部分可以大大提高考试时的阅读速度,因为所有的句子练习均仿照各项考试中针对此词的常考句型而设。
