前 言

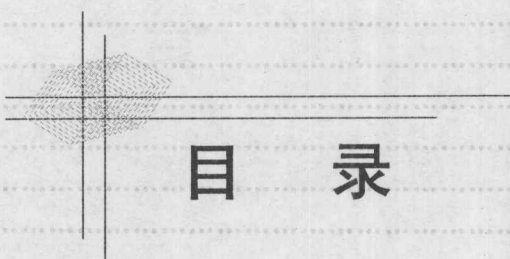
为了全面体现大学英语教学改革突出大学生英语综合运用能力的要求,使测试更好地服务于教学,大学英语四、六级考试对英语听说能力的测量进行了有效的衡量,那就是大幅度地提高听力测试在四、六级考试中的比重。听力理解部分比例由原来的 20% 提高到了 35%。

为了帮助考生全面了解并能从容应对 2007 年 6 月开始全面实施的改革后的六级考试,编者根据《大学英语六级考试试点考试样卷》编写了 15 套听力模拟题。本书紧扣六级考试改革要求,结合最新六级考试样卷和历年六级考试真题,深入剖析六级听力考试的规律和趋势,对新旧题型层层分析、各个击破,为考生更快、更好地突破改革后的六级听力提供制胜之道,是集指导、练习于一体的指导书。

值得提醒六级考生的是,改革后的六级听力在原有的短对话、短文理解和复合式听写的基础上新增加了长对话,并改变了原有的每次考试只出现两种题型的模式,即短对话+短文理解/复合式听写的模式,短对话听力、长对话听力、短文听力和复合式听写四种题型将同时出现在每次考试当中。基于此,本书全面剖析了四种六级听力题型,深入分析各种题型的发展趋势和命题规律,并总结相应的应试技巧,为考生提供切实有效的解题方法。

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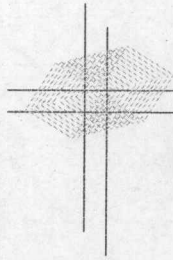
