- 二、对原"附录1"的有关文字说明,编号、标号以及答题纸的设计等,作了统一修改。

三、对"附录2"中的个别编排校差误,作了修正。四、将1998年试题更换为1999年试题。

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考试说明

全国硕士研究生人学考试是为高等学校和科研机构招收硕士研究生而设置的。其中,英语实行全国统一考试。它的评价标准是高等学校非英语专业优秀本科毕业生能达到的及格或及格以上水平,以保证被录取者具有一定的英语水平,有利于各高等学校和科研机构在专业上择优选拔。

考试对象为 2000 年参加全国硕士研究生人学考试的本科应届毕业生,以及符合报考条件的具有同等学力的在职人员。

本考试对课程和教材不作统一规定,凡符合下列评价目标的 课程及教材都适于考生应考复习。

一、评价目标

考生应掌握下列语言知识和技能:

(一) 词汇

考试所涉及的词汇、短语基本限于本大纲附录 2"词汇表",总量为5 300个左右。

- (二) 语法
- I. 词法
- 1. 动词的时态、语态、语气及情态动词、非限定动词的用法
- 2. 名词、形容词和副词的用法
- 3. 介词、连词和代词的用法
- Ⅱ. 句法

简单句、并列句和复合句的结构及用法

(三) 阅读理解能力

考生应能综合运用英语语言知识和阅读技能来理解英语书面材料,能以每分钟 60 词的速度阅读各种题材(社会生活、人物传记、科普、史地、政治、经济等)和体裁(议论文、记叙文、说明文、应用文等)的文字材料(生词量不超过文章字数的 3%)。

考生应能:

- 1. 掌握所读材料的主旨和大意;
- 2. 了解用以阐述主旨的事实和有关细节;
- 3. 根据上下文判断大纲附录 2"词汇表"以外的某些词汇和短语的意义;
- 4. 既理解单句的意义,也理解上下句之间的逻辑关系:
- 5. 根据所读材料进行一定的判断、推理和引申;
- 6. 领会作者的观点和态度;
- 7. 正确理解英语原文并用汉语表达原文所述内容。

(四) 书面表达能力

- 1. 根据所给题目或素材写出叙述、说明或议论性的短文;
- 2. 语言比较规范,条理清楚。

二、试卷结构及考试形式

试题为主、客观混合型。客观题分数占总分的 70%,主 观题分数占总分的 30%。本试卷分五部分,共 76 题。考试时间 为 180分钟。

试卷分试题和答题卡(纸)两部分,考生应将第一、二、三部分的答案填写在答题卡(ANSWER SHEET 1)上,将第四、五部分的答案写在答题纸(ANSWER SHEET 2)上。

第一部分 语法结构与词汇

40 小题,每小题 0.5 分,共 20 分。

题目分三节:

A节 语法填空,10 题,共5分。每题为一个或两个句子,其中留有一个空白处,要求考生从所给的四个选择项中

选出一个最佳答案:

- B节 语法辨错,10 题,共 5 分。每题为一个或两个句子,有四个划线部分,其中一处是错误的,要求考生将错误项选出;
- C节 词语填空,20 题,共 10 分。每题为一个或两个句子, 其中留有一个空白处,要求考生从所给的四个选择项 中选出一个最佳答案。

第二部分 完形填空

10 小题,每小题 1 分,共 10 分。

在一篇短文中,有 10 处空白,每个空白为一小题。每题有四个选择项,要求考生在理解文章的基础上,选择一个最佳答案,使短文的内容和结构完整、合理。

第三部分 阅读理解

20 小题,每小题 2 分,共 40 分。

阅读五篇左右的短文,阅读量为 2 000~2 500 词。每篇短文 后有 3~5 道选择题,共计 20 题。考生应根据短文内容从各题的 四个选择项中选出一个最佳答案。

第四部分 英译汉

5小题,每小题3分,共15分。

在一篇短文中有五个划线部分,考生应根据上下文将各划线部分译成汉语。要求译文准确、完整、通顺。

第五部分 短文写作

1题,15分。

考生应根据题目以及写作提纲或规定情景、图表、图画等写出不少于 150 词的短文。要求内容切题,表达清楚,意思连贯,语言比较规范。


