### 前言

《英语(一)专项训练与仿真模拟》适合参加高等教育自学 考试的非英语专业专科考生。

为帮助参加全国高等教育自学考试的广大考生在短时间内全面复习应考,迅速提高考试成绩,笔者参照《英语(一)考试大纲》要求对近几年来全国高等教育英语自学考试试卷进行了综合分析,研究总结了命题模式、思想、方法、原则和规律,并对今后命题趋向做了预测,在此基础上又根据全国高等教育自学考试指定教材《大学英语自学教程》(高等教育出版社)编写了这本专项训练与仿真模拟试题集。本书具有"全、真、快"三大显著特点:

全: 专项训练从考题的四大部分人手,对每一部分都做了大量的集中训练,从不同角度、不同层次覆盖了大纲规定的全部内容。
