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总前言

随着国内外形势的发展,如中国加入世界贸易组织、北京申奥成功等,掌握外语已成为人 们的迫切需要。

听力是学习与掌握外语的重要技能之一,也是中国人学习外语的弱点与难点,有必要进行 专门的训练。

此系列教材适用对象是具有初级及略高于初级英语水平的人群。它能帮助参加高考的考生应试英语,也有助于参加国内外各种英语考试如 IELTS、PETS 的人打好听力基础,同时更适于作为基础英语听力训练的课堂教材及自学教材。

编者认为提高听力与掌握一定的词汇量、基本的语法、句型和一定的背景知识密切相关。 同时听力技能的提高不是孤立的,它与整个语言水平、综合能力的提高密不可分。此系列教材 是以此为出发点并结合中国人学习英语的实际情况编写的,因此具有以下特点。

1. 内容上以基本词汇与语法为主,技能训练上以听力为主。

本系列教材的练习册部分分为"词汇篇"和"语法篇"。"词汇篇"每课的第1部分出现某一题材的词汇,如亲属、职业、食物、数字、方位、服装、建筑、交通、山脉、江河、国家、城市、运动、动物、植物、天气、旅游等。"语法篇"每课的第1部分出现某一语法内容。语法包括了基本词法、句法及常见的语言点。

2. 内容相对集中。

学生围绕某一重点学习效果较好。书中的词汇以专题集中出现,各语法及语言点也一一分别集中出现。

3. 注意内容的重复与滚动。

为避免语言现象集中出现而学新忘旧,特别注意了内容的复现与滚动,为此安排了复习和总复习。

4. 练习形式多样,有针对性。

本书有几十种不同的练习,生动活泼,有效地训练学生的听及读写说的能力。尤其编写了针对中国学生弱点的练习,如帮助学生克服注意听时顾不上读与写,听懂了内容却记不住信息等困难;再如编入了他们的典型错误使其明辨正误。

5. 教材的内容安排科学。

"词汇篇"和"语法篇"每册各 25 个单元,每 6 个单元为一组,每组的第 6 个单元是该组的复习。"词汇篇"的第 25 单元是该册的阶段复习,"语法篇"的第 25 单元是全套教材的总复习。

此系列教材包括"词汇篇"和"语法篇"两本练习册及它们各自的学习参考书,**共计4册**, "词汇篇"和"语法篇"另外**各配录音带一套**。练习册是练习用书,学习参考书中有全部听力原 文及答案,并在相应部分标出重点,便于自学。由于本系列教材包括了各方面的基本词汇和基 础语法,内容丰富,题材多样,不失为一本综合教材,听力训练后可利用学习参考书全面复习以 提高综合能力。本教材中有各种考试中常见的形式,对于要参加各种考试的考生会大有帮助。

本书已在北京语言文化大学出国人员培训部试用几年,效果良好。但缺点错误在所难免, 望多批评指正。
