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前 言

近几年来,我国大学生、研究生的英语水平,尤其是阅读水平有了很大的提高。他们中有许多人都顺利通过了全国英语四、六级考试,部分学生甚至在托福考试中也取得骄人的成绩。但是,我在长期的大学外语教学、特别是硕士研究生的外语教学中却发现,这些学生的实际应用能力、特别是口头表达能力,与他们在各种英语资格考试中所获得的高分非常不相称,很不尽人意。同时,他们自己也为这一"高分低能"而困惑和苦恼,常常在课上课下向我询问,如何能够在资格考试之后进一步继续提高自己的实际应用英语的能力,特别是听和说的能力。

根据自己十多年来讲授研究生英语听力的经验,我发现在他们这个水平阶段,《走遍美国》(Family Album USA)这类视听材料略显简单,而新闻类听力材料又相对单调。他们普遍对语言素材多样的英语原版电影感兴趣,但其深厚的文化背景和社会内容,快速流畅的语速和不合书面语法的表达方式,都令他们望而生畏。因此,他们虽然爱看原版电影,但通常是根据中文字幕和说明来理解内容,或者是根据人物的体态语言和面部表情来猜测剧情,从语言学习的角度来讲,收效不大。

如何针对学生的兴趣,因势利导,利用相对丰富的英语影视资源,提高学生的英语听说能力,是我一直思考的问题。为此,我在研究生视听课教学中,有意识地补充自己从海外访问中收集到的影视资料、特别是电影资料。经过几年的实践,同学们普遍反应学习英语的兴趣大为提高,英语语感明显加强,听说能力改善许多。同学们的这一反应,进一步加强了我科学地利用电影资源改进英语视听教学的决心和信心,也正是同学们的肯定鼓励了我,使我能

够在两年的时间里编著出眼前这本视听教材。

《电影视听英语教程》(Film for Fluency)精选八部美国近年来出品的较为优秀的影片,它们题材广泛,内容多样,涵盖了当代美国家庭、社会、教育、政府、法律和网络技术等生活中的各个方面。根据视听教学的特点和中国学生水平,从各部影片中筛选出适合进行听说训练的三至四个片断。每个片断都有一至两个场景,相对独立。所选片断语速适中,并包含了许多教科书中不常出现但实际生活中却经常使用的词汇。通过反复练习,学生可望进一步提高听力水平,了解英语口语的基本特点,使自己的口语表达更自然、更地道。

全书分八个单元,一部电影为一单元,每个单元包含三至四个章节。每个单元的开始有英文和中文的剧情简介,还有在各个片断中出现的主要人物。每一章的教学设计如下:

第一部分: Words and Expressions (生词和词组)。这些词语有不少经常出现在口头对话和电影对白中, 而学生因接触机会较少, 无法听懂。

第二部分:Comprehension Check (理解测试)。学生在看完或听完该章节后,可以进行自测,找到影响理解的听力障碍,然后有针对性地再次进行视听。

第三部分: Transcript(录音文字)。供学生自学时参考。对于听力基础差的学生,不妨边听磁带,边看文字,从而进一步掌握地道的英语发音,纠正自己因发音不准造成的听力障碍。

第四部分: Practice Section(练习)。该项包括各种形式的词汇练习和供学生进一步思考的讨论题。学生通过练习将对电影中出现的词汇有更深的印象, 对电影中涉及的背景知识有更好的了解。

第五部分:Supplementary Cultural Background or Characteristics of Spoken English (补充文化背景知识或口头英语特点介绍)。

口语特点介绍主要列举听力材料中的口语表达。学生可反复聆听电影中的这些句子,直至自己能脱口而出。

本书适合大中专院校中高年级学生和研究生、英语专业学生, 特别是已通过托福、雅思等考试,但仍想进一步提高听说的英语学 习者。

在编写本书的过程中,我得到了很多外国朋友无私的帮助,对此我深表谢意:Elizabeth Bowditch 博士多年来一直为我收集原版录像带提供帮助;Sam & Mary Pearson 夫妇、Jennifer Latham 和来自英国的刘民权教授帮助我解决了若干审听中的疑难问题。我也感谢南京大学研究生院对我工作的支持,允许我为研究生开设同名选修课,使我能够通过教学实践来完善这一教材。我特别要感谢南京大学一霍普金斯大学中美文化研究中心教授任东来博士,他以一个多年的英语学习者和美国问题研究者的身份给我提供了宝贵的意见和建议。
