accord with, 相 稱.

Your actions do not accord with your words. according to, 按照.

According to my opinion any government is of the class, by the class, and for the class.

You must account to your master for the money you have received.

accrue to, 增加.

The profits accrue to him from the business.

accurate in, 精於; 正確.

He is accurate in bookkeeping.

add to, 增加.

He should advise with every person willing to give him advice.—Goldsmith.

affection for. 愛.

He has an affection for her.

She is greatly afflicted at the loss of her child.

afflicted with. 受痛苦.

He is afflicted with his ghostly enemies.

afraid of. 怕.

He was sick of life; but he was afraid of death.—Macaulay.

aggravated at, 不滿意於(物).

He is aggravated at your work but not at you.

aggravated with, 怨恨; 不滿意於(人).

He is aggravated with you but not with your work.

agree among, 一致.

We must agree among ourselves.

agree in. 贊同.

I agree in opinion with the speaker.

agree to. 贊成.

At last he agreed to my proposal.

agree with, 贊同.

I agree with you to your proposal.

agreeable to, 適合.

The plan was not agreeable to his wishes. aim at, 目標在.

He aims at being considered a poet.

alarmed at, 驚 懼.

You were alarmed at a crash.

alarmed for, 為.....而 擔 心.

He is alarmed for the safety of his brother. alien from, 異於; 不同.

How pitiable to see this infirm old man so ambitious of a name for wealth.

amuse with, 娱以.

I amused the guests with music.

analogous to, 相似.

Decay of public spirit, which may be considered analogous to natural death.—J. H. Newman.

angry at, 怒 恨 (對 事 物).

Don't be angry at anything without cause.

angry with, 怒 恨 (對 人).

Your conduct is enough to make your master angry with you.

annoyed at, 惱 恨.

I was annoyed at my mistake.

annoyed with, 厭 煩.

He was annoyed with you for your persistency. answer for, 擔 保; 報 應.

I will answer for his safety.

Let his neck answer for his crime.

answer to, 相稱;配合.

The copy answers to the original.

antagonistic to, 反對.

He was antagonistic to the party.

apart from, 分離.

He sat apart from the other men.

apologize for, (自己)抱歉.

I apologize for my delay.

apologize to, (向人) 道歉.

I must apologize to you for not replying to your letter at once.

apparent in, 明 顯.

His guilt is apparent in every act to all observers.

appeal for, 請求.

They appeal for justice.

appeal to, 合意.

Such a style does not appeal to me.

appetite for, 慾望;喜歡.

He had an insatiable appetite for the marvelous.

applicable to, 適合; 切當.

Your criticisms are not applicable to the subject.

application for, 自 薦.

He made an application for that post.

application to, 應用; 專心.

He gave much application to study.

apply for, 願為.

One of the girl students applied for the work as an actress.

apply to, 適用.

The law does not apply to this case.

appoint to, 派 定.

He appointed me to the post.

appropriate to, 相合; 適宜.

Music appropriate to the occasion.

approve of, 讚許.

No one approves of his conduct.

approve to,表示可嘉;自勉以使人讚許.
Approve yourself to your teacher.

apt to, 易於.

He is apt to spend his money pretty freely. arbitrate between, 仲 裁.

Who can arbitrate between the capitalists and the laborers?

argue about, 辯論.

Let us argue about the subject, but not quarrel among ourselves.

argue against, 辯 駁.

Some people argue against the struggle between masters for advantages in markets.

argue for, 辯 護.

No wise man will argue for war.

argue with, 爭論.

Do not argue with a lawyer for your debts.

arrange in, 整理; 佈置.

A book arranged in such order as to form a systematic and complete treatment of the subject, is called a treatise.

arrange with, 約定; 議 妥.

We cannot arrange with our enemy in this conjecture, without abandoning the interest of mankind.—Burke.

arrayed against, 相率反對.

All around them seemed arrayed against them.—

arrive at, 求到; 達到. [Byron. When does the mail plane from Hankow arrive at Nanking?

As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.—Bible.

ashamed of, 有愧.

Are you ashamed of yourself?

ashamed to, 蒙愧.

We should be ashamed to waste our precious time.

ask about, 詢 問.

We ask a person about a thing.

ask after, 問 安.

I met my uncle on the way and he asked after my family.

ask for, 乞求.

The beggar asked me for a loaf of bread.

ask of, 請 問.

The child asked a strange question of its mother. assent to, 允許.

The princes assented to all that was suggested.
assimilate to, 適應. |—Macaulay.

Every one assimilates more or less to the custom of his time.

assimilate with, 類似; 同化.

Can we assimilate with the Western civilization?

associate with, 結 交.

I must associate with people of good conduct.

assure of, 確 知.

It is idle to propose remedies before we are assured of the disease.—Swift.

astonished at, 詫 異.

He seemed quite astonished at your zeal.

atone for, 贖罪.

Nothing could atone for the offender.

attach to, 趨 附; 心 服.

His kindness attaches us all to him.

attack on, 攻擊.

Don't make an attack on the innocent.

attend at, 到會.

I attended at the meeting. (or, I attended the meeting.)

attend on, 侍 候.

My wife and maid are attending on our guests.

attend to, 留心.

One should attend to one's own business.

attention to, 注意.

Pay attention to the use of prepositions.

attentive to, 留心.

A pupil should be attentive to his teacher.

authority on, 有權威; 專於.

He is a great authority on that subject.

authority over, 管治; 有權管...

He has no authority over me.

avail of, 利用.

I have availed myself of the first good opportunity.—Dickens.

avenge on, 報 仇.

He avenged himself on his enemies.

awake to, 敏於.

He is not awake to his opportunities.

aware of, 驚醒; 覺察.

Are you aware of your real position?

babble of, 癡談.

back up, 作後盾.

You are always ready to back up your friends.

bad for, 有害於.

Smoking is bad for health.

Banish the gods from the skies and capitalists from the earth.—W. M. Brown.

banish to, 充 軍; 放 逐.

Napoleon was banished to St. Helena.

bare of, 缺少.

Some parts of China are very bare of trees.

bark at, 吠; 駡.

The dog is barking at me. He would bark at anybody.

based on (or, upon), 基 於.

His thought is based on the scientific interpretation of history.

battle against, 攻打.

It is a battle against capitalism.

He battled against his enemies.

battle for, 為……而 戰.

War is the battle between masters for advan-

tages in markets.

We battle for freedom.

battle with, 相 戰.

Revolution is the battle of the slaves with the masters for a reversal of conditions.

They battle with their oppressors.

bear with, 容 忍.

I could not bear with him, on account of his high temper.

beat against, 打擊.

The wave beat against the shore.

beat on (or, upon), 打擊.

Revolutional socialism beats upon the gods and capitalists.

because of, 因 為.

He was absent because of sickness.

become of, 結果; 了結.

No one seemed to care what had become of me.

beg for, 請求.

As I am very busy now, I beg for a little more delay.

beg of, 求 討.

I beg of you for some money.

believe in, 信 仰.

I believe in Materialism.

belong to, 屬於.
