使用说明

本书以澳大利亚杰克伦达出版公司出版的同义词近义词手册为基础, 经编译而成。编译的内容包括:对所有词目均加注了国际音标和中文释义; 对所有例句均进行了汉译;对少数词目和例句以及用法,根据我国读者的 情况,作了适当的增删调整等。本书可供高中及大学非英语专业学生、中 学教师及程度相当的英语工作者使用,有助于使用者扩大词汇量,提高阅读理解水平及写作能力。

全书有900组左右同义近义词。每组有一个基本词及4—5个同义近义词,总共收入近5000个词。基本词入选时只认定一个词义,环绕这一个词义组成一组同义近义词。其中有些词在书中出现几次,但每次出现只代表一个词义。有许多词释义并不单一,属于同组的各词,有时词义很近,也有相去较远,是考虑实用才辑在一组的。

各组的基本词释义用双解,其余的词只有中文释义。基本词的英文释义本身也就是一个同义词或短语。同组词在用法上的差异有简明指示附在 释义后的括号里。也有少数地方释义本身是唯一的辨析参考。

全书各词配有一个例句(个别词有两句)。例句反映了该词最常用的搭配关系。例句译文力求通顺上口,不死扣原文词序或原词词类。

本书各词目注有通用的国际音标。动词短语只注动词的音标。个别极普通的词则省去音标。

凡标明为"日常用语"的词,即指该词属于 slang 或 colloquialism。 不少同义近义词组下方列出对应的反义词或其它相近同义词。不过这 些词以收入本书的为限。

本书属于手册一类工具书,所以力求简明扼要,查阅省时,不拘泥于词义辨析。本书依据的原著于1986年问世,读者留心学习便于更新自己的语言材料。

abduct [æb'dakt] v.

to take someone away by force 将某人强行带走,绑架,诱拐

The terrorists abducted the president as he was walking to his car. 当总统向自己的汽车走去时,几个恐怖分子绑架了他。

kidnap ['kidnæp] 诱拐,绑架

Some criminals kidnapped the millionaire's daughter. 几个犯罪分子 绑架 了百万富翁的女儿。

shanghai [ʃæŋ'hai] 拐骗人上船当水手

In times of war soldiers used to go from town to town looking for men to shanghai into the navy. 战时,士兵经常挨着城镇寻找男子,把他们骗上船去当水兵。

poach [pəutʃ] 偷猎, 偷捕

Our chickens keep disappearing so we think someone is poaching them. 我们的鸡老是不见,所以我们想准是有人在偷鸡。

similar words: capture, steal

abrupt [ə'brʌpt] adj.

rude and quick-tempered 无礼的, 脾气急躁的

He gave an abrupt answer. 他给了一个无礼的回答。

hort [ʃɔ:t] 无礼的,唐突的

She was very short with me whe. I asked her the time. 我向她询问时间的时候,她对我非常无礼。

curt [kəlt] 简短的,礼貌不周的

His curt reply hurt me. 他简短无礼的回答刺痛了我。

brusque [brask] 粗鲁的, 唐突的

His brusque manner upset me. 他粗鲁的态度使我感到不快。

blunt [blant] 直言不讳的

They gave a blunt refusal to our request. 他们断然拒绝了我们的请求。

abundant [ə'bʌndənt] adj.

more than enough 丰富的, 大量的, 充裕的

The canteen had an abundant supply of sausage rolls. 小吃都里有大量的香肠肉馅卷供应。

ample [ˈæmpl] 宽敞的, 充足的

There was ample space for us all to fit in the car. 这辆车子很宽敞,我们大家都可以坐进去。

plentiful ['plentiful] 大量的,丰富的(含义比基本词弱些)

The town has a plentiful supply of food. 该镇的食品供应很充足。

bountiful ['bauntiful] 丰富的

The rains produced a bountiful harvest. 雨水带来了丰收。

copious ['kaupjas] 大量的 (有时强调庞大,而不是丰富)

We took copious notes during the lesson because our teacher was revising the term's work before the exam. 因为老师正进行考试前的总复习,所以我们在课内做了大量的笔记。

prolific [prə'lifik] 多产的,多育的

We have a prolific orange tree in the backyard and always have enough oranges for our family and friends. 我们后院里有棵多产的桔树,它结的桔子总是够我们一家和朋友们吃的。

similar words: numerous, sufficient contrasting words: scant, insufficient

accidental [æksi'dentl] adj.

happening unexpectedly or by accident 偶然的, 意外的

Don't get angry with him for breaking the window because it was purely accidental. 不要因为他打碎了窗子而生他的气,这件事纯属意外。

chance [tfa:ns] 偶然的

I came across this valuable old vase by a chance visit to a junk shop. 这 只古老的花瓶是我偶然走进一家旧货店时看到的。

coincidental [kəu,insi'dentl] 巧合的

It was coincidental that we both went to the movies yesterday. 昨天我们两人都去看电影是个巧合。

random ['rændəm] 无目的的,随便的

Father likes to take random walks round and about the town. 父亲欢喜在镇上随便逛逛。

haphazard [ˌhæp'hæzəd] 无计划的,随意的

He made many errors because he worked in such a haphazard way. 他出了这么多的差错只怪他办事无计划。

contrasting word: deliberate

acclaim [ə'kleim] v.

to praise someone with sounds of approval 喝采, 对人欢呼

The crowd acclaimed the footballer with shouts and clapping. 大伙儿 喊啊、鼓掌啊,向足球健儿们喝采。

applaud [ə'plɔ:d] 鼓掌表示赞同

The audience applauded the boy at the end of his song. 这孩子唱完后, 听众对他鼓掌表示夸奖。

clap [klæp] 鼓掌赞许

They clapped the funny clown after he had performed some clever tricks. 那逗人的小丑演完几个巧妙的把戏以后,他们就向他鼓起掌来。

cheer [tʃiə] 欢呼

We cheered the winner as he crossed the finishing line. 那位优胜者越过终点时,我们朝着他欢呼。

toast [taust] 举杯祝贺

We toasted the new president of the club. 我们向俱乐部的新主席举杯 祝贺。

honour ['onə] 给以荣誉

The Queen honoured the great scientist by making him a knight. 女皇對这位大科学家为骑士,以示殊荣。

accompany [əˈkʌmpəni] v.

to go or be with someone 陪, 伴

I am going to accompany my parents on their overseas trip. 我将陪同我的父母到国外去旅行。

partner ['pa:tnə] 作伴, 合伙

He promised to partner his sister for the next dance. 他答应在下一场舞中当他妹妹的舞伴。

escort [is'ko:t] 护送

The police escorted the prime minister back to his hotel. 警察护送首相返回旅馆。

chaperone ['ʃæpərəun] (在交际场所)监护, 陪伴某人使举止得体

The teachers will chaperone the children at the school dance. 在学校 舞会上,老师们将陪伴学生充当监护人。

associate with [ə'səusieit ~] 结交,与…交友

She only associates with girls from her own class. 她只同自己班上的女同学往来。

accomplish [ə'kəmpli]] v.

to carry something out successfully 完成, 实行

Congratulations! You have accomplished a difficult task. 祝贺你! 你完成了一件艰难的工作。

achieve [ə'tʃi:v] 完成, 达到(目的), 实现

You will have to work hard to achieve your ambition to be a musician. 你要勤奋学习才能实现你的抱负,当一个音乐家。

attain [ə'tein] 努力达到,如愿

He attained his goal of coming first in English. 他达到了目的:英语考了个第一。

fulfil [ful'fil] 完成(计划),履行

He fulfilled his promise to repay the debt. 他履行诺言,还清了欠债。

realize ['riəlaiz] 实现,实行

He realized his dream when he won the prize. 他得了奖,实现了他的梦想。

carry through ['kæri ~] 贯彻,完成(计划)

She carried her plan through with great courage and determination. 她以极大的勇气和决心完成了她的计划。

accuse [ɔ'kju:z] v.

to blame someone openly for doing something wrong 控告, 指控

He accused the boy of cheating in the test. 他指控那个男生考试作弊。

denounce [di'nauns] 声讨, 谴责

The leader of the revolution denounced the traitors. 这位革命领袖谴责了那些卖国贼。

frame [freim] 陷害, 诬陷

I didn't do it your honour, he framed me. 法官先生,我可没有干这种事。他诬陷我。

charge [tʃa:dʒ] 告发, 认为有…的嫌疑

The police charged her with speedy driving. 警察指控她超速驾驶。

indict [in'dait] (法律上正式)对…起诉, 控告

He was indicted on a charge of theft. 他被控告犯有盗窃罪。

allege [ə'led3] 声称, 断言

The shopkeeper didn't see the girl steal the book but he alleges it. 店老 板并未看见她偷书, 却断言她偷了。

contrasting work: forgive

achievement [ɔ'tʃi:vmənt] n.

something you gain by hard work 成绩, 成就

They praised him for his achievement in completing the marathon. 他跑完了马拉松全程。他们表扬了他的这番成绩。

accomplishment [ə'kəmpli]mənt] 完成,实现,贯彻

All nations must work for the accomplishment of peace. 世界各国都要为和平的实现而出力。

fulfillment [ful'filment] 完成,达到

The little house in the country was the fulfillment of her dreams. 这座乡村小屋实现了她的梦想。

attainments [ə'teinmənts] 成就,造诣

He is a man of great attainments in several fields. 他是一个在好几方面都有造诣的人。

feat [fi:t] 功绩, 绝技

It was a great feat to climb to the top of Mount Johno Lungma. 登上了

珠穆朗玛峰可是件了不起的功绩。

contrasting word: failure

actual ['æktjual] adj.

existing in fact 实际的, 真实的

What is the actual location of the ship now? 现在该船的实际位置在什么地方?

real ['ri:ol] 真正的(强调外表与本质的一致)

We have a real Swiss cuckoo clock at home. 我们家里有一只真正的瑞士杜鹃钟。

concrete ['konkri:t] 具体的, 有形的

The remark was a concrete example of his rudeness. 他的这句话是他粗鲁的具体表现。

tangible ['tændʒəbl] 可触及的,有实质的

A ghost is not a tangible thing. 幽灵是看不见摸不着的。

material [mə'tiəriəl] 物质的,有形的

Her big house and car are the material signs of her success. 她的大房子和汽车是她成功的物质上的证据。

physical ['fizikəl] 物质的,肉体的

We need money to buy things for our physical needs. 我们需要钱来买东西,以满足物质上的需要。

contrasting words: shadowy, imaginary

add [xd] v.

to join something on to something else in order to increase it in size or number 加, 增, 添

Add another bead on to the necklace to make it longer. 再往项链上加一颗珠子,好使它长一点。

supplement ['saplimant] 增补,外加

She supplements her pocket money by babysitting. 她靠替别人照看孩子来增添一些零用钱。

throw in [θrou ~] 额外地增加

append [ə'pend] 附上

We appended the cheque to the letter. 我们在信中附上了支票。

tack on [tæk ~] 添加

They tacked another room on to the shed. 他们在小屋子外又造了一间房间。

attach [ə'tætʃ] 附上,加上

Attach a stamp to the envelope and mail it. 在信封上贴张邮票,把信寄了。

similar words: enlarge, insert

contrasting words: subtract, remove, reduce

admit [ad'mit] v.

to agree that something is true 承认

I admitted that I had broken the vase. 我承认花瓶是我打碎的。

confess [kən'fes] 坦白, 承认

I confessed that I had not listened when she told me to be careful. 我承认,她关照我仔细一点的时候,我没有听。

blurt out [blə:t ~] 脱口而出,漏出

I meant to keep it a secret but then I blurted it out. 我本想保守秘密, 可随即我说漏了嘴。

acknowledge [ək'nɔlidʒ] 承认,供认

I acknowledged that it was kind of her to forgive my carelessness. 我承认,她很大度,原谅了我的疏忽。

unburden [ʌn'bɔ:dn] 倾吐(心里话), 说出

I felt better after I unburdened myself and told her what I had done. 我向她倾诉了自己干了什么事之后,感到舒坦了一点。

concede [kən'si:d] (勉强)承认

I concede that your request is reasonable. 我承认,你的要求是合理的。

similar word: reveal contrasting word: hide

adult ['ædalt] adj.

grown-up or fully grown 成年的,成熟的

The adult birds are quite a different colour from their young. 成年的 鸟 和幼鸟的颜色截然不同。

mature [mə'tʃuə] 成熟的(精神、智力等方面)

He can make up his own mind now that he is a mature man. 他已成熟了,因而他能够自己作主。

ripe [raip] 成熟的(果实、时机等)

Are the tomatoes ripe? 这些蕃茄熟了吗?

contrasting word: young

advance [əd'va:ns] v.

to move or go forward 推进, 往前走

She advanced to the front of the room. 她往房间的前面走过去。

progress [prəˈgres] 前进,向前走

The circus parade progressed slowly down the road. 马戏团的队伍沿着大 海 街慢慢地向前移动。

make headway [meik 'hedwei] 向前进

The car made little headway in the heavy rain. 大雨滂沱, 这辆汽车只能 慢慢地前进。

proceed [prə'si:d] 前进(尤指继续前进)

We drove carefully over the sloppy road because the sign said "Proceed with caution". 路标上写着"小心前进",所以我们在这条泥泞的路上很小心地开着车子。

push on [pu] ~] 费力地前进

The weary travellers pushed on from one town to the next. 疲倦的游客们费力地从一个城镇走向另一个城镇。

forge ahead [fo:d3 o'hed] 努力前进

The explorers forged ahead through the thick bush. 探险家穿过浓密的树林不断地前进。

contrasting word: reverse

advise [ad'vaiz] v.

to tell someone what you think should be done 忠告,给…出主意,劝 The doctor advised his patient to get more exercise. 医生忠告他的病人多多锻练。

guide [gaid] 指导,引导

His mother guided him in his decision to stay at school. 在母亲的劝导下,他决定住在学校里。

suggest [sə'dʒest] 建议

My tennis coach suggested that I practise my backhand. 我的网球教练建议我多练反手。

propose [prə'pəuz] 提议

She proposed a good method of raising money. 她提出了一种筹款的好办法。

recommend [,rekə'mend] 推荐

The librarian recommended this book to me. 图书管理员把这本书推荐给我。

advocate [ˈædvəkeit] 提倡

Our dentist advocates brushing your teeth after every meal. 我们的牙科医牛提倡每餐饭以后刷牙齿。

similar word: warn

adviser [əd'vaizə] n.

someone who tells you what they think you should do 顾问

She is a very wise adviser so I usually do what she suggests. 她是个很好的顾问,因而我常常照她的建议办事情。

guide [gaid] 指导者,领路人

I let him be my guide when I'm not sure what to do. 我感到不知所措的时候就请他来指点。

mentor ['mento:] (受到信赖的)指导人

Her father has been her mentor for many years. 她的父亲多年来 是 她 信赖的指导。

counsellor ['kaunsələ] 顾问,辅导员

The school counsellor helped me to decide what I should do. 学校辅导员 帮助我决定我应该做什么。

leader ['li:də] 领导人

Harold was named leader of the fundraising drive. 哈罗尔特被提名为票 指运动的领袖。

similar word: teacher

aggressive [əˈgresiv] adi.

likely to attack others 好进攻别人的, 气势汹汹的

He is only aggressive if you tease him. 在你嘲弄他时,他才显得气势汹汹。combative ['kombətiv] 好战的

She has a combative nature and seems to enjoy fighting. 她具有好战的性格,所以看上去喜欢打架。

belligerent [bi'lidzərənt] 好战的, 好斗的

Her belligerent behaviour towards her friends surprised us. 她对待朋友的那种挑衅的态度使我们感到惊奇。

pugnacious [pʌg'neiʃəs] 爱吵架的

He is so pugnacious that the others have stopped trying to be friends with him. 他真爱吵架,所以别人都不再想同他交朋友了。

hostile ['hostail] 怀有敌意的

Her hostile reply to our invitation upset us. 对我们的邀请,她报以怀有敌意的回绝。我们为此感到不快。

similar words: argumentative, warlike contrasting word: submissive

agile ['ædʒail] adj,

lively and active 轻快的, 敏捷的(可指精神上和肉体上)

The agile gymnast did the most difficult exercises with ease. 这位敏捷的体操运动员轻而易举地完成了高难度动作。

athletic [æθ'letik] 强壮的,活跃的

Our runners are very athletic, which is why our school won the cross-

country race. 我们的赛跑运动员非常健壮。这就是为什么我们学校能在越野跑中获胜的原因。

sprightly ['sprait]i] 生气勃勃的, 轻快的

He played a sprightly tune on the recorder. 他用录音机放出一首轻快的乐曲。

nimble ['nimbl] 敏捷的, 灵活的

Her nimble fingers made playing the piano look easy. 她的手指灵活,弹起钢琴来,看上去十分容易。

spry [sprai] 活泼的, 生气勃勃的(常指出乎意料的情况)

He is a spry old man and climbs all the stairs to his flat. 他是个生气勃勃的老人,总是爬楼梯回公寓。

light [lait] 轻快的, 灵便的

He was very light on his feet when he danced. 他跳起舞来脚步十分轻快。

contrasting word: clumsy

agree [ə'gri:] v.

to say yes or to have the same opinion as someone else 同意, 取得一致 意见

I agreed to his plan. 我同意他的计划。

concur [kən'kə:] 同意某事

I concur with your decision. 我同意你的决定。

assent [ə'sent] 同意(主要用于书面语)

The council members assented to the suggestion to build a new school. 委员会成员同意建造新学校的建议。

consent [kən'sent] 同意(别人的要求)

The firm will consent to your taking a leave of absence. 公司会同意你请事假的。

see eye to eye 跟某人意见一致

My sister and I see eye to eye on which TV programs we like to watch. 在喜欢看什么电视节目这方面,我的姐姐和我意见是一致的。

contrasting word: disagree

agreeable [ə'gri:əbl] adj.

pleasing or to your liking 招人喜欢的,令人愉快的 She is a very agreeable person to be with. 跟她相处使人感到愉快。

good-natured [gud 'neit[ad] 脾气好的,容易相处的

He's so good-natured everyone wants to be on his team. 他这个人容易相处,所以大家都想参加他的球队。

likeable ['laikəbl] 可爱的

The new girl was very likeable and fitted into the class easily. 新来的女同学很可爱,所以跟全班同学很容易地打成了一片。

amiable ['eimiəbl] 和蔼可亲的, 亲切友好的

I rang my friend and we had an amiable conversation. 我给朋友打了电话,作了一次亲切的交谈。

charming ['tʃa:min] 招人喜爱的, 迷人的

He is a charming boy and is sure to be class captain. 他是一个招人喜爱的男同学,肯定会当上班长。

similar words: nice, friendly contrasting word: nasty

alert [ə'lə:t] adj.

watching things carefully and quick to react 有警惕的,反应快的
The guards were alert to any danger. 警卫员对于任何危险反应都是很快的

watchful ['wot]ful] 小心的,警觉的

She was always watchful when her children were swimming. 孩子们在游泳的时候,她一直是十分小心的。

ebservant [əb'zə:vənt] 注意观察的

The observant girl noticed where the biscuits were kept. 这个善于观察的小姑娘注意到饼干藏在什么地方。

attentive [ə'tentiv] 注意的,专心的

Only the most attentive people saw how the trick was done. 只有最仔细的人才看到这种把戏是怎么变的。

awake [ɔ'weik] 注意着的,普戒着的
