



Preview of Dialogue



Jen: Hmm, the first thing I think about is Email. I think that's the most useful part of the Internet for me.

Doug: Not me. You can get a lot of entertainment from the Internet. I'd say that's what I use it for the most.

James: Entertainment, eh Doug? What kind of entertainment?

Doug: Well... I'd rather not say...

Dave: People often joke about that, but that's a very big part of the Internet. Pornographic material makes up about 30% of all Internet content or so I've been told.

Mr. Pan: That's right, Dave, and it is a problem, especially for children who might find it by accident. This is definitely *a downside to* the Internet.

Jen: Well, you have to *take the good with the bad*, right? In this case, it seems that the good outweighs the bad *by a longshot*.

Sean: Imagine how slow mail would be without Email!

James: The Internet definitely makes life more convenient. This is, after all, the "information age", isn't it?

Doug: I'd say that really sums it up. Information is moving faster and more freely than it used to be.

Dave: It's certainly hard to ignore the reality of how much the Internet has affected our lives. It seems that no matter where you turn, you can't get away from it.



Dave: You see how much the Internet has impacted on our lives? Everyday, we're on the net.

Sean: Of course, we are. Just look at how much fun we can have.

Doug: The Internet isn't just for fun, Sean. I used to spend a lot of money calling my family, but now I use the Internet and it saves me *a ton of money*.

James: Sounds like you're a slave to the net. Not me, I use it as a tool, it doesn't use me.

Mr. Pan: It's not about Email though, guys. The Internet is the biggest source of information we have, as they say "Information is power".

Jen: Better, faster, and more information. There are on-line libraries and **E-schools** on the Internet that have virtually unlimited amounts of knowledge.

Dave: Yeah, but that's not all. Just the other day, I did some on-line banking. It surely makes life convenient.

James: I've also heard that E-business is pretty big these days, too. You know, **on-line trading**, placing orders over the internet, and so on.

Sean: But really, what all these boil down to is the freer movement of information. That's it.

B. Point of interest

a) I use it as a tool

When James says that he uses the Internet as a tool, it doesn't use him, he is saying that he is in control of his usage of the Internet. This is important because many people tend to become addicted to the Internet these days and spend too much time using it. In fact, children in most Internet developed countries are spending more time on the Internet than they are playing with other children. They are even spending close to the same amount of time on the Internet as they spend in school.

b) What do people use computers for?

A word processor is a computer used to prepare documents or letters, etc. Many people use their computers for word processing, e.g., writing letters and reports. A lot of business people use spreadsheets, which are a program used to enter and arrange numbers and financial information, and databases programs, which allow you to store, look at or change a large amount of information quickly and easily. Some people also use graphics which are the pictures and symbols a computer program can produce.
