序

GRE 是 GRADUATE RECORD EXAM 的縮寫,它是進入美國大學研究所就讀必須參加的一種考試。它共分三部份: VERBAL SECTIONS(英文), QUANTITATIVE SECTIONS(計量),及 ANALYTICAL SECTIONS(分析)。這三部份的試題以 VERBAL SECTIONS 最令學生感到頭痛。因爲它的試題内容變化多端,英文單字更是艱深難懂,即使對美國大學生來說也是一大難題。本書就是針對以上的困難,將 GRE 考試範圍內的單字加以有系統的整理而編寫。不但單字量多完備,而且單字的解釋完全以 GRE考試的內容爲標準,力求明確。現將本書編字的方式概略解釋如下:

- 1. 本書所選單字約 4,000 字以上,足夠準備 GRE 之用。
- 2. 每個單字後附有 K.K. 音標、英文解釋、中文翻譯及例句。
 - 3. 單字是以英文字母順序排列,以便學習者查閱。
 - 4. 書前附有 WEBSTER(韋氏)及 K.K. 音標對照表。

在美國大學中,韋氏系列的字典使用廣泛,所以熟悉韋氏 音標將會使學生在美國很快進入學習情況。

5. 書後附有英文字源介紹,其中包括主要的字根、字首及字尾,在此作者要建議一點,字源只是認識及記憶英文單字的輔助常識。它們不是萬能,也不能取代背誦單字。如果光背字源而忽略了單字本身,那就變成本末倒置了。

本書內容是以英文爲主,中文注解僅供參考。此乃因 GRE 是一種高級英文考試,試題內容的了解及答案的選擇不 是靠字面的翻譯,而是靠對英文字句及本意(DE-NOTATIONS)及含意(CONNOTATIONS)的體會。在此祝各位考試順利。
