本丛书每本均由栏目导言、词汇菜单、正文、旁注和相关知识五个部分组成。栏目导言画龙点睛，撩拨心弦，使读者产生阅读的渴望。词汇菜单罗列了与本栏目相关的词汇、词组200余条，它们既可作为阅读前期的“热身”，亦可作为语言学习上的参考。在正文部分编者以独特的视角，精挑细选，择优拔萃，文章体裁多样，内容丰富，令读者爱不释手。旁注为词汇量有限的读者提供了方便的查阅空间、相关知识或恰到好处地扩展了与本文有关的内容，或寓教于乐，寓庄于谐，为读者提供立体的背景信息。

## Bathrooms In America



Americans are particular about their toilets. Every house has more than one, each *facilitated*<sup>1</sup> with a *tub*<sup>2</sup>, a water closet and a washbasin. No tub is installed in case the toilet adjoins the Parlour. What is amusing about the American toilet is that it is invariably called "bathroom". Every water closet is fitted with a small exhaust fan and in the main one there is usually a scale to weigh oneself.

Americans set strict demands on the tidiness and tastefulness of their bathrooms, no less strict than on those of their kitchens and bedrooms. Inside the bathroom, utensils are properly clean; the whole room is brightly lit-up and the walls are hung with *handicrafts*<sup>3</sup>. Chinese Americans in this respect, naturally do as the Romans do. In the morning both my daughter and granddaughter were in a hurry to go to office and school, while I often, snatching at the break when my daughter was bathing in the tub behind the glass-glazed door and her child washing at the washbasin, discussed daily chores with them, taking my seat on the *flannel*<sup>4</sup>-covered toilet. At this moment, the bathroom became a family meeting room and we felt nothing vulgar about this but something homely and entertaining.

Individually built toilets are rare in public places except at the seaside or in densely-wooded parks with a large expanse of glass. Toilets in public places are in general attached to a given incorporation and are built into the main structure. It is *stipulated*<sup>5</sup>, for example, that at least one toilet is required for a gas station, a midway resting place by the expressway, a restaurant or snack-bar, a department store, not to speak of those for conference halls, office buildings, exhibitions and scenic spots. Some public water closets are even provided with special cells for the handicapped. All public water

closets are not equipped with bath facilities and are called "restroom", the front walls of which are invariably hung with conspicuous *silhouettes*<sup>6</sup> of men and women so as to make sure that nobody goes the wrong way; the inner facilities are in no way inferior to those in the pay toilet in mainland China; the toilet are set in cells with bolt-on doors; toilet paper, liquid soap and towels are supplied free; *sanitary*<sup>7</sup> conditions are always well-kept there and I was never embarrassed by tap-water failure or closet blocking. This is partly due to the fact that Americans *cultivate*<sup>8</sup> from childhood the habit of taking care of public utilities, and that these toilets are under the charge of an incorporation concerned and their conditions have a direct bearing on its successful performance. Chinese students, starting on an odd job in a restaurant there, are often *harshly*<sup>9</sup> scolded by the boss for their negligence in cleaning the toilet. The boss will rip out, "If customers get sick of our messy toilet, how can we do any business?"

At first I was always on the alert against such public water closets for fear that I'd *contract*<sup>10</sup> skin diseases. My daughter said, however, that she had never heard of such cases. Once at Chicago Airport I found the toilet-seat covered with a plastic sheeting; the moment the flank button was pressed, the sheeting would jump off and be placed by a new one. I could not help marveling at the novelty of the design.

Repairmen bring with them portable toilets while engaged in the maintenance of expressways or other construction sites, where no *accommodation*<sup>11</sup> is available. The *portable*<sup>12</sup> toilet is shaped like a frame which is big enough to hold one person, with a direction wheel attached to it at the bottom. There are also toilets in long-distance buses. In U.S., unlike the case in China, toilets on the train never allow night soil to be released on the tracks. But toilets of this kind smell somewhat, and that's understandable, for there is not enough water and conveniences to clean them.
