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内 容 提 要

本书选材十分广泛,18个单元涵盖了数字、时间、家居生活、交通、购物、职业、使用说明、广告、旅游、健身、医疗、电话、新闻、音乐和友情等方面,在材料篇幅、语言结构和信息量上都反映了听力训练循序渐进的规律,如一至七单元侧重听力基本技能训练,八至十八单元为主题会话,重点则转到听力综合训练。

另外,本书练习方式活泼,题型多样,采用了大量表格、图形、照片等直观感强的形式,改变了传统听力练习题枯燥、呆板的老面孔。同时鉴于听与说的密切联系,书中每一单元都附有难度适中、可行性强的口语练习,旨在学以致用。

本书附有练习答案,并配有磁带,适用于大学英语课堂教学和具有同等英语水平者使用。

前 言

随着改革开放的进一步深入,中国正大步走向世界。空前频繁的国际交往使不少用人单位对当今大学毕业生的英语综合能力,尤其是听、说能力提出了更高的要求。

目前,我国在校大学生学习英语的机会和精力都主要集中在大学英语四级基础上。由于种种原因,不少高校对大学英语四级后的继续教学重视不一,造成大学英语教学后继乏力,听力教学则基本上是个空白。听力是英语学习中的重、难点,突破它不仅有利于提高学生学英语的兴趣,而且也是学生实际语言交际能力培养和提高的前提与关键。鉴于此,我们本着易学、实用和有效的原则,针对广大高校学生继续提高英语听力的要求编写了 Progressive Listening 听力教程。

全书分为18个单元,配有录音磁带,并附有全部录音稿。所有听力材料均选自国外最新的有声资料,具有语言新、真实度高,练习形式活泼等特点。录音音质清晰,以标准英国音和美国音为主,并辅以其他讲英语国家的语音,以增加学生的听音空间,帮助他们熟悉和了解不同的英语口音,从而达到培养和发展学生英语实际使用能力这一根本目的。
